### When are we coming back to church?

I have heard that question many times. It is so hard for us to be away from our church and the friends that we meet there.

But coming back to church is not going to be easy, nor will it look like church used to.

On June 12th, Stage 2 of relaunch began and the Alberta Health Officer said that there is no limit to the number of people who can be at worship any more. Some folk got very excited about that. BUT... we still need to practice social distancing, sanitize in and out, clean the building before and after use, we can't sing, we can't have coffee time together. We are also still not supposed to have vulnerable folk (over 65, health compromised) join us.

So, if we opened up our buildings for worship, you can't sit beside your friend, you may not be able to sit in your favourite pew, you have to come in one door and exit through another, you can't sing your favourite (or Helen's new) hymns, you get to go home directly after the service without hugs, handshakes or coffee.

How would it feel to be told you can't get into the church because we've already reached our number limit? How would it feel if you were told that you weren't allowed to come to church because you're over 65 years old but your child can because they are only 59 and they don't want to go anyway:)?

I am missing you in church... but I show up every Sunday to lead worship online and we deliver bulletins to folk too. I look forward to seeing your faces back in our buildings, but not yet. I want to welcome you back without reservation but not until it is safe. Not until we can **all** be together.  $\mathcal{H}elen$


A little bit of Team work and we're looking pretty!

### Financial support for the Church in unusual times.

In all of our four Pioneer Pastoral Charge churches, we have dedicated supporters who offer not only their time and talent for the work of the church, but also are our source of financing to keep our doors open and our Minister paid, general building costs like power, water and heat still need our attention.

**Some folk have chosen to give by PAR.** This means that their offerings will still come to the church regularly. Thank you for this support.

Some folk are much less comfortable with electronic funds and prefer to give their offerings by writing cheques or giving cash. When we are not gathering for worship, the contributions from this group are being affected. We are asking you to think about how you can continue to support your church.

- 1. You can mail cheques to the office. These can be deposited by our Envelope Secretaries or Treasurer according to your schedule.. Post-dated cheques are also welcome.
- 2. You can arrange an automatic deposit from your bank during this time.
- 3. You can join the Pre-authorized Remittance (PAR) program, ensuring that your support continues to be received on a monthly basis. You can receive a form for this by contacting Helen at the office or picking up at form at the Oyen United Church West Entrance.

#### Supporting your church... every little bit helps

**Bottles:** We are still collecting bottles for recycling at the Oyen United Church. Just drop them off in the blue bins at the church, or let the Bottle Depot know to send the funds to us.
