Dear Church Family,

I preached two funerals this past Thursday. One was at 11am. The other was at 2pm. In between the services we fed both families in different parts of our Family Life Center. Now I've preached many funerals before under all sorts of different circumstances. At least on two occasions I've preached double funerals where there were two caskets at the front of the Sanctuary. This often takes place when a husband and wife die in close proximity to one another. But this week's back-to-back funerals on the same day, however, was a first for me. Needless to say, I've spent a large amount of time this past week thinking about death and being around people who were grieving a terrible loss.

It was an honor to officiate each of the services. Both families are very special and I wanted to do my best to remember their loved ones well and share God's Word with compassion and power. Funerals are very important. They're important to family and friends who are hurting. They're important as opportunities to remember and celebrate the deceased. They're important as occasions to consider our own lives. They're also important for how they speak to the dignity and worth of what it means to be human and created in the image of God. Life matters. Our lives matter. The lives of our loved ones indeed have mattered. Funerals recognize and express these realities

Funerals are also an occasion for wisdom. The Bible says that "The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning" (Ecc. 7:4). This means that death can be a valuable teacher. More than anything else, death offers to instruct us in the ways of a proper perspective. It reminds us what are the important things in life. It also reminds us that one day our lives will come to an end. The problem is that these are not easy lessons to learn. They're sobering, humbling, and potentially even life-changing.

What would you do if you only had 24 hours left to live? Most of you would probably want to spend that time with your closest family and friends. You would wish to cherish every last moment. Maybe you would try to right a few wrongs you've made along the way. The wisdom of mourning says you don't have to wait until you only have 24 hours left to live to do any of these things. Learn wisdom and go ahead and do them now. James 4:14 says, "You do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." There is much wisdom in these words if we will accept it.
