The Transfiguration of the Lord

This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.

Matthew 17:5

TODAY'S READINGS

First Lesson: Exodus 24:12-18 One can see the similarities between this passage and the account of Jesus' transfiguration. Here, on a mountain top, God is revealed to Moses declaring the covenant being made with Israel. It is call to remain faithful to God.

Epistle: 2 Peter 1:16-21 One of the centralities of the Christian faith is "mystery". Here, the author of this epistle describes the transfiguration of Jesus Christ as an event pertaining to the mystery of his Second Coming in glory.

The Gospel: St. Matthew 17:1-9 The account of Jesus transfiguration is one of the greatest events in the earthy life of Jesus. In part, it is to bring us into a deeper sense of the mystery of God, but also to make the connection between Jesus as Messiah, along with Moses and Elijah who were seen as God's messengers of the Old Testament.
