After beginning a career as a carpenter and cabinet maker, Hall earned a Bachelor of Architecture degree from the University of Texas at Austin and practiced both privately and as a staff architect for the Texas National Guard at Camp Mabry.

Hall was a consummate professional, but the only things he took seriously were his family, work, friends, his word, and naps. Hall loved to fish, and while he was never happier than being on the water, he was often kind enough to leave the fish in their homes.
