WHY FORGIVING OTHERS IS DO DIFFICULT:

1) It can be so exhausting

- ²² For I am poor and needy, and my heart is wounded within me. (Psalm 109:22-24)
- ²³ I fade away like an evening shadow; I am shaken off like a locust.
- ²⁴ My knees give way from fasting; my body is thin and gaunt.
 - 2) It can take longer than we want it to
 - 3) It doesn't always erase our memories
 - 4) It doesn't always change the offender's heart

²¹ Then Peter came to him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?"

²² "No, not seven times," Jesus replied, "but seventy times seven!

SO, WHY FORGIVE?

1) God wants us to forgive

(Colossians 3:13) "Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others."

2) Forgiveness will bring us peace and healing

(**Proverbs 18:14**) "The human spirit can endure a sick body, but who can bear a crushed spirit?"

3) Forgiveness allows us to move on with our life

(Genesis 50:20) "You intended to harm me, but God intended it all for good. He brought me to this position so I could save the lives of many people."

4) Forgiveness keeps us from resentment

(Romans 12:19) ¹⁹ Dear friends, never take revenge. Leave that to the righteous anger of God. For the Scriptures say, "I will take revenge; I will pay them back, "says the LORD.

(**Hebrews 8:12**) "And I will forgive their wickedness, and I will never again remember their sins."
