



Life Group Questions (Micah 2)

1. Read Micah 2 together. What stands out to you from this passage? What questions come to mind? What stood out to you from Sunday's message?
2. Micah 2 tells us that the people were devising ways to do evil, coveting their neighbour's fields and houses and treating widows and children with contempt. Read Romans 1:28-32. Why does it seem inevitable that when people remove God from their lives it ends up in moral decay and wickedness? Have you seen this in your own life?
3. Does verses 12-13 seem out of place in this chapter? Why do you think Micah goes back and forth between judgment and hope? Why do most of the prophets do this? What does this reveal about God's character?
4. What is your reaction when you are confronted with sin? Do you resist the truth, becoming angry or defensive? Or do you try and fix the problem on your own?
5. In 1 Corinthians 1:28-31 Paul says that Jesus is our wisdom, redemption, righteousness and sanctification. Why is this so important to remember as we battle sin and follow Jesus?
6. Read Romans 7:7-25. Does Paul's experience with sin sound familiar to you? (this is not an excuse for sin but a very real description of what sanctification looks like) Romans 8:1 tells us there is no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus. When you sin, do you feel condemned? Is that from God or Satan?

Spend some time in prayer together. If there is sin in your life confess it and repent of it. Ask God for the gospel to sink deep into your hearts. Thank Jesus that he is your redemption and righteousness and sanctification.
