HOW VOTING WILL WORK

Since we are still conducting virtual meetings, the vote process will be the same as it was for our December 2020 congregational meeting. This means that the vote for *in favour*, *opposed* and *to abstain*, will require two steps each.

- First is a **show of hands** for anyone with video. This is the quickest and easiest way
 for your vote to be counted. We ask that everyone keep their hands up until all
 votes have been counted. For those without video, you can type your response in
 the chat channel.
- 2. The second step is for a **verbal confirmation** for anyone without video or chat typing availability. This will be primarily for people who may be calling in by phone.

Call to Order

Motion to allow adherents to vote (members only)

MEMBERS vs. ADHERENTS

The first motion today is for members only and it will be to extend voting privileges to Cloverdale United Church adherents.

A **member** has been baptized (not necessarily in the United Church) and then has either been confirmed as a teenager or has gone through membership classes as an adult and made promises called an 'adult affirmation of faith' during a worship service. If you haven't been baptized, you would be baptized at that same service. Please contact Susie in the office and she can ensure your request regarding the process gets to the appropriate person.

Once a member you have the right to vote on congregational matters, however, having a membership at another church does not automatically make you a member of Cloverdale United. You are required to transfer your membership from

your previous community of faith to Cloverdale. Transferring membership is a simple process that Susie can get you started on.

An **adherent** is an attendant of the congregation, which means that you attend and or contribute regularly to the life and work of the congregation, but you are not a member. Many of you will fall into this category, and like members, you are valued participants in the life of this congregation. And it is for that reason that we have members vote to extend the privilege of voting to include adherents.

Blast from the Past № 18

Chocolate Pizza - Dianne Nichols

1 cup chocolate chips
1 tsp baking powder
1 cup Crisco shortening
2 cup all purpose flour
2 cup granulated sugar
2 tbsp water

2 tosp water 2 tosp water

2 eggs

Melt 1 cup chocolate chips with ½ cup Crisco in a double broiler or over hot water; cool. Stir in flour, sugar, eggs and baking powder; mix well. Spread evenly onto greased 12 inch pizza pan. Bake at 375 F for 15 minutes. Watch edges; do not overcook. Cool.

Combine ¾ chocolate chips with 2 Tbsp Crisco and water. Microwave in 30 second intervals until smooth. Spread over cooled pizza. Decorate as desire for occasion. Recipe can easily be doubled for a large pizza pan.
