Seder Dinner - April 1, 2021

On Thursday April 1 we will be celebrating Maundy Thursday with a Seder Dinner.

A Seder meal is a Jewish tradition that was set out in the book of Exodus as a means of remembering the original Passover when the Hebrews were finally freed from the clutches of Pharaoh.

A Christian Seder takes the same basic preparation and elements of this Jewish meal and ritual, modifying some parts. It is celebrated on Holy Thursday as the Last Supper celebrated by Jesus and his disciples was almost certainly a Seder meal.

This year we will gather in our own homes meeting via Zoom, reciting the story of Israel's redemption from bondage in Egypt.


