I. A PECULIAR PARABLE:	
A. The Setting:	
 A Master- a very rich man 	
- an absentee landlord	
 hired out to various managers 	
 A Steward— hired to invest his master's wealth 	
- Making deals + collecting bills = \$\$\$ Increase

B. The Situation: The steward has been wasting his	
Masters wealth (also see— Lk.15:13)	
Fired (Note: no jail time; nothing illegal done)	
Bring in the books— give an accounting.	
What to do with his future?	
- Dig ditches— too hard; can't physically do	
- Beg on the street— humiliating; too proud	
* "Find someone else to take care of me!"

C. Cooking the Books: Calling in the debtors
