SERMON: JESUS THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE

John 11:1-53 (CSB)

LAZARUS DIES AT BETHANY

Now a man was sick, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha.

- 2 Mary was the one who anointed the Lord with perfume and wiped his feet with her hair, and it was her brother Lazarus who was sick. 3 So the sisters sent a message to him: "Lord, the one you love is sick."
- 4 When Jesus heard it, he said, "This sickness will not end in death but is for the glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it." 5 Now Jesus loved Martha, her sister, and Lazarus. 6 So when he heard that he was sick, he stayed two more days in the place where he was. 7 Then after that, he said to the disciples, "Let's go to Judea again."
- 8 "Rabbi," the disciples told him, "just now the Jews tried to stone you, and you're going there again?"
- 9 "Aren't there twelve hours in a day?" Jesus answered. "If anyone walks during the day, he doesn't stumble, because he sees the light of this world. 10 But if anyone walks during the night, he does stumble, because the light is not in him."
- 11 He said this, and then he told them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I'm on my way to wake him up."
- 12 Then the disciples said to him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will get well."
- 13 Jesus, however, was speaking about his death, but they thought he was speaking about natural sleep. 14 So Jesus then told them plainly, "Lazarus has died. 15 I'm glad for you that I wasn't there so that you may believe. But let's go to him."
- 16 Then Thomas (called "Twin") said to his fellow disciples, "Let's go too so that we may die with him."

THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE

17 When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. 18 Bethany was near Jerusalem (less than two miles away). 19 Many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother.

20 As soon as Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him, but Mary remained seated in the house. 21 Then Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother wouldn't have died. 22 Yet even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you."

- 23 "Your brother will rise again," Jesus told her.
- 24 Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."

25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me, even if he dies, will live. 26 Everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

27 "Yes, Lord," she told him, "I believe you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who comes into the world."

JESUS SHARES THE SORROW OF DEATH

28 Having said this, she went back and called her sister Mary, saying in private, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you."

29 As soon as Mary heard this, she got up quickly and went to him. 30 Jesus had not yet come into the village but was still in the place where Martha had met him. 31 The Jews who were with her in the house consoling her saw that Mary got up quickly and went out. They followed her, supposing that she was going to the tomb to cry there.

32 As soon as Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and told him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother wouldn't have died!"

33 When Jesus saw her crying, and the Jews who had come with her crying, he was deeply moved in his spirit and troubled. 34 "Where have you put him?" he asked.

"Lord," they told him, "come and see."

35 Jesus wept.

36 So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" 37 But some of them said, "Couldn't he who opened the blind man's eyes also have kept this man from dying?"

THE SEVENTH SIGN: RAISING LAZARUS FROM THE DEAD

38 Then Jesus, deeply moved again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. 39 "Remove the stone," Jesus said.

Martha, the dead man's sister, told him, "Lord, there is already a stench because he has been dead four days."

40 Jesus said to her, "Didn't I tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?"

41 So they removed the stone. Then Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you that you heard me. 42 I know that you always hear me, but because of the crowd standing here I said this, so that they may believe you sent me." 43 After he said this, he shouted with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" 44 The dead man came out bound hand and foot with linen strips and with his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unwrap him and let him go."

THE PLOT TO KILL JESUS

45 Therefore, many of the Jews who came to Mary and saw what he did believed in him. 46 But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done.

47 So the chief priests and the Pharisees convened the Sanhedrin and were saying, "What are we going to do since this man is doing many signs? 48 If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."

49 One of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all! 50 You're not considering that it is to your advantage that one man should die for the people rather than the whole nation perish." 51 He did not say this on his own, but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus was going to die for the nation, 52 and not for the nation only, but also to unite the scattered children of God. 53 So from that day on they plotted to kill him. -- John 11:1-53 (CSB)

SERMON NOTES

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. When the disciples questioned Jesus' decision to go to Bethany Jesus answered them with "Aren't there 12 hours in a day?" Jesus answered. "If anyone walks during the day, he doesn't stumble, because he sees the light of this world. If anyone walks during the night, he does stumble, because the light is not in him." (John 11:9-10) What did he mean?
- 2. Why was Jesus glad that he wasn't with Lazarus when he died?
- 3. What does it say about Thomas when he said, "Let's go so that we may die with Him?" (11:16)
- 4. Why do you think that some people, even when confronted with somebody coming back from the dead still refuse to believe what their eyes have seen?
- 5. How could it be that God's own priests, those who ministered before him daily in the temple could still remain so detached from the obvious signs of God?
- 6. We're told that in the last days the Beast will do incredible miracles, there will even be an imitation resurrection. (Rev. 13:3) Is there a lesson here that we can learn from the priests of Jesus' time?
- 7. How can we avoid falling into the trap of being too skeptical or not skeptical enough?
- 8. What do you think of Caiaphas' solution, do you think there is ever a time when someone should be sacrificed for the sake of the many?

Dear colleagues in ministry,

Today I received an email from a brother in Christ, Joel Jupp, who serves as music director at the Lombard CRC in the Chicago area in the USA. In addition, he also edits documents in his other time. He is looking for someone who can be an English editor to help him, someone in Australia to cover his late night and overnight orders.

This is what he wrote to me:

In short, I have been overworked for a very long time, and I need to find a good, trustworthy, honest, and flexible person to help me. It'd need to be someone strong in English grammar, and someone who checks their messages (so I can ask them if they want to edit). Again, it'd be paid (1-2 cents/word). I'm part of a CRC church, so my dad actually had the good idea of contacting you. Since I edit things like medical studies, I need to find trustworthy people, so we thought the CRC would be a good place to start. My issue is that if I received a document late at night, it can be easier to have someone help overseas.

My wife has been battling cancer, and we are very concerned of some recent tests. While I don't like talk about it, and while we hopefully pray for God to display his power, I also know that God wants me to be responsible for the sake of my family (we have three kids). Should God choose to bless us with a miracle, I would still need help either way.

For my full-time work, I lead worship music at Lombard CRC church. Since my wife and daughter are high risk for COVID-19, we've been in quarantine for 11 months, and I've been helping to record music and help oversee online services for the church during the pandemic. As you can imagine, that ministry also takes a lot of my focus.

Perhaps you know of someone in your church who is looking to do some work from home, who meets some/all of the requirements Joel mentions above. I have checked out Joel's references, and can vouch for Joel with his requests/expectations. If you have someone (or several) in mind, please pass on their contact details to me, and I will personally forward them to Joel. In this way we can be of assistance to our brother, who is facing various challenges, both personally and work-wise. This might also be off good benefit to someone you know.

Please send me a quick reply, so I can do likewise in response to Joel.

May God continue to bless and guide you in all that you do in life and in ministry.

- ⇒ Pray for our nation that the Holy Spirit will reclaim our nation for himself and move mightily to bring the people back to God.

Please pray for God's people in Iran. According to the Iranian regime, Iran respects religious freedom and Christians currently serving prison sentences in Iran are not in prison because of their faith. Rather, it insists, the condemned Christians have all been found to be members of 'enemy groups' that, 'under cover of promoting Christianity', spread 'evangelical Zionism with a view to enmity and confrontation with the Islamic Establishment and subversive acts against it ...'

THE BUSHEHR EIGHT On 27 January the fourth Branch of Bushehr Court of Appeal upheld the custodial sentences against Habib Heydari (38) and brothers Sam (36) and Sasan (35) Khosravi. The three men were among a group of eight believers (four men and four women; including three married couples) arrested on 1 July 2019 in a house church in the city of Bushehr in south-west Iran. While Sam and Sasan's mother were released because of her age, the remaining seven believers were charged with 'actions against national security', 'gathering and collusion against the state' and 'membership of an illegal organisation'. They were released on bail on 16 and 17 July 2019 and sentenced on 21 June 2020. The three women/wives were hit with fines and work bans while the men received custodial sentences. Pooriya Peyma (28) was sentenced to 91 days in prison, while Habib Heydari and the Khosravi brothers were each sentenced to one year in prison, after which the Khosravi brothers must also serve two years in internal exile.

Christian convert Ebrahim Firouzi (34) has endured a decade of severe persecution. After six years in prison, five of which were spent in the notorious Rajaei Shahr prison in Karaj (a maximum-security prison housing the state's most violent criminals and terrorists), Firouzi was released on 26 October 2019 to serve a further two years in internal exile in Sarbaz County, some 1600km southeast of Tehran, in Iran's remote south-east. In September 2020 police stormed Firouzi's home in Rask village, Sarbaz County. They confiscated his laptop and mobile phone, along with the textbooks he was using to study theology online – textbooks published with the permission of the Ministry of Guidance. Subsequently, Firouzi was summoned to the local prosecutor's office to answer fresh charges of 'insulting the sacred', which carries a maximum five[1]year jail sentence and 'propaganda against the state through promoting the Christian faith', punishable by up to a year in prison. On 27 September the prosecutor threw out the charges due to lack of evidence. In early February 2021, with the

authorities still refusing to return his property, Firouzi publicly

protested his treatment in a series of videos published on the Facebook page of a Swiss-based activist. It only took days for the regime to strike back. On 7 February Ebrahim Firouzi was given five days to report to the prosecutor's office in Sarbaz city to answer the allegation that he has engaged in 'propaganda against the Islamic Republic in favour of hostile groups'; a charge which could see him returned to prison for another three years. — Elizabeth Kendal

- intervene on behalf of the long-suffering and faithful Ebrahim Firouzi; may he be assured of the Lord's eternal presence and sustaining grace; may Firouzi's 'light' (Matthew 5:14-16) continue to shine brightly despite all efforts by the regime-of-darkness to suppress it.
- And may the Lord Jesus Christ continue to build His Church in Iran. 'Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord of hosts' (from Zechariah 4:6 ESV).
