

OPENING HYMN: CP 444 (vs 1-4) Your Hand, O God, Has Guided

- 1. Your hand, O God, has guided your flock from age to age; the wondrous tale is written, full clear, on every page. Our forebears owned your goodness and we their deeds record, and both of this bear witness: One church one faith, one Lord
- 2. Your heralds brought glad tidings To greatest as to least; they bade them rise, and hasten to share the royal feast; and this was all their teaching, in every deed and word, to all alike proclaiming One church one faith, one Lord
