Text: Romans 3:21-26

Intro:

Romans 3:21-26

The story of Jesus' death on the cross represents the solution to a problem that seemed impossible.

1. None of us are righteous in our relationship with God

"Righteous" is a relational word. It means to live up to the terms and expectations of a relationship.

Romans 3:10-12, 23

2. God is completely righteous

God's righteousness requires him to act justly, dealing with sin.

Romans 6:23

God's mercy and patience makes it look like he's condoning sin (Romans 3:25).

How does God deal with this problem?

He demonstrates his righteousness - Romans 3:25-26

2 Corinthians 5:21

Romans 3:21-24
