

HOPE FOUND IN PAPER CRANES

News from ELCA Global Mission:

Pastor Kazuhiro Sekino, an International Leaders scholarship recipient from the Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church, recently found a creative way to offer hope to COVID-19 patients at Abbott Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, where he's currently interning as a chaplain. Drawing from a Japanese tradition, Sekino began to fold paper cranes to give to patients — and soon his efforts

were multiplied when people in Japan sent thousands of paper cranes to the hospital. "Paper cranes now are a spot of healing for [patients]," Sekino said.

News from the IK Synod: Dear People of God,

As we wind our way through Lent toward Easter, we also appear to be getting closer to the far side of the coronavirus wilderness. The daily number of new COVID-19 cases has been decreasing. More and more people are receiving their vaccinations. Fewer counties across the synod territory are in the red zone. We give thanks to God for this and for the many people in various vocations

who have given so much of themselves to make this possible, as well as the millions of citizens who have contributed by wearing masks and diligently observing other health protocols in order to slow the spread.

News from the ELCA:


On Feb. 1, the ELCA churchwide organization implemented Future Church, a new working structure focused on motivating the entire church to actively share the way of Jesus with more people so that they might experience community, justice and love. The design emphasizes the belief that members. congregations, synods, the churchwide organization and its partner organizations all have important roles in the church's mission. The church's three expressions

(congregations, synods and the churchwide organization) will remain, but the Future Church design is centered on a "One Church" identity that will bring greater collaboration to the mission of sharing the gospel and God's grace in the world. 
