We all carry scars. Some of the them are quite visible—the marks we wear on our bodies from surgeries or accidents. Other scars are quite deep, too deep really, so we try to hide them.

I find it quite interesting that after Easter, when Jesus appeared to his followers he chose to return wearing his scars. Presumably Jesus could have had any resurrected body he wanted, and yet he chose one identifiable mainly by the scars that could be seen and touched. Why?

It seems to me the story of Easter would be incomplete without those scars on the hands, feet, and side of Jesus. When human beings fantasize, we dream of pearly straight teeth, wrinkle-free skin and sexy ideal shapes. We dream of an unnatural state: the perfect body. But for Jesus, being confined in a skeleton and human skin WAS the unnatural state. The scars are, to him, an emblem of life on our planet, a permanent reminder of those days of confinement and suffering.

This part year with the pandemic, we all bear some internal scars. Plans changed. Loved ones sick or even lost to COVID. Jobs changed or at least altered. Familiar routines and traditions like graduations, weddings, funerals, confirmation, all of which were affected. To say our world was turned upside down is an understatement. This past year, we have all been scarred at some point.

So I take hope in Jesus' scars. From a faith perspective, his scars represent the horrible event that happened in the crucifixion and God's power to bring healing and new life to it. Because of Easter, I can hope that the tears we shed,

the blows we receive, the emotional pain, the heartache over lost friends and loved ones, all these will become memories, like Jesus' scars. Scars never completely go away, but neither do they hurt any longer. In faith we see the amazing ways God is at work redeeming, recreating and renewing our world today. Easter gives the world and ourselves, a new start, an Easter start.

Three Ways to Worship: In Person, Online and Radio!

We have now successfully added another way to worship—in person in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 am. To gather both faithfully and safely, we will have to:

- * Register ahead of time for worship (registration will open Wednesday mornings)
- * Limit our gatherings to 75 people
- * Wear masks, social distance and wash hands
- * Allow the song leaders to sing while you enjoy their sounds
- * If you are feeling ill for any reason or have been exposed, please stay home and enjoy worship via the livestream or radio.

As a reminder, the church Fellowship Hall and Office have new bipolar ionization technology that cleans the air and refreshes the room every fifteen minutes. We are pleased we can again offer three ways to worship each Sunday. As the weather warms, we hope to also offer a brief outdoor option for those who are not comfortable being indoors. Please continue to pray for our pastors, worship leaders, musicians and webteam as we try to safely and faithfully worship together.

Sunday, April 18, 3:30 pm—Open Our Hearts to Earth: *Hope for Creation* will honor Earth Week with a Poetry Reading by Barbara Draper and Thomas R. Smith at the Glen Park Pavilion in River Falls. Draper is a Minneapolis poet whose first book of poems (*Sometimes a Door*) was published in 2019. Smith is an acclaimed River Falls poet and teacher whose many works have been widely published and praised nationally and internationally. Celebrate an outdoor Spring day with them and *Hope for Creation* at the Pavilion.

Mission Partner: Turningpoint

In 2021 Turningpoint for Victims of Domestic and Sexual Violence is again a Mission Partner of the church. Turningpoint began as a crisis line and an all-volunteer "safe house" program. In 1989, after nearly a decade of renting shelter facilities, Turningpoint conducted a successful capital campaign to build its own facility, its first 14-bed shelter, which remains the only domestic and sexual violence crisis shelter in all of Pierce and St. Croix Counties.

Today, in addition to providing shelter and 24-hour crisis counseling, Turningpoint offers legal system support, children's programming, violence prevention education, safety planning, support groups, and emergency food and hygiene products. Turningpoint has been the state-designated Sexual Assault Services Provider (SASP) for Pierce and St. Croix Counties since 1995.


Turningpoint also operates Second Chances Thrift Store in downtown River Falls. Victims and survivors of violence receive vouchers to obtain clothing, furniture, and household goods from Second Chances. Second Chances Thrift Store is also open to the public and is almost entirely operated by volunteers. Earned revenue from Second Chances Thrift Store comprises approximately 20% of Turningpoint's annual operating budget.

In 2016, with the generous support of the community, Turningpoint was able to expand its crisis shelter from 14 to 21 beds, with the potential for future expansion of up to 25 beds. Turningpoint's mission is to provide support and resources to achieve freedom from domestic and sexual violence. We are grateful for its good work!

Ways to Reach Out to Others

All of us want to do something to help and be Jesus' loving disciples in the present moment. Below are some specific things you can do at home:

Shut-ins/Seniors: We have connected our seniors/shut-ins with church families who send them notes, small parcels and kid's artwork. If you want to be matched with a shut-in, contact the church office.

Compassion Fund: There are families in our church who have been furloughed, fired, and laid off. We will be able to offer some modest assistance to these families through our church Compassion Fund. Gifts should be mailed to the church and marked 'Compassion Fund.' Families who need assistance, please contact Pastor Chris.

Prayer: Prayer connects us with God and our neighbors. Pray for the helpers. Pray for your families. Pray for people losing their jobs. Pray for students learning online. Pray for families learning new routines. Pray for people cooped up inside. Each week there is a prayer list of people, situations and thanksgivings that is sent out by email to help people in their prayer life. You can sign up by contacting the church office.

Sign Up Sheets: All of the current sign-up sheets are on the church website. Click on the "Connect" button at the top of the page and then select "Sign Ups/Forms."

Quarantining: With the spread of COVID-19, more and more families are having to quarantine at some point. Please know that your church stands ready to support and help you as we can. We have volunteers who can run errands, pick up medicine or food, even deliver your Sunday School materials if you are quarantined. Please also know church staff are here to help you navigate the intense emotional pressures these situations bring with them.
