It is kept for you in heaven, and you, because you put your faith in God, are under the protection of His power until salvation comes- the salvation which is even now in readiness and will be revealed at the end of time.

All-powerful and ever living God, grant to us thy servants that we may with pure hearts and minds enter into the mysteries of the Paschal Feast; and, being risen with Christ, may rejoice in the glory of them that are born again. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lesson: This perishable being must be clothed with the imperishable, and what is mortal must be clothed with immortality. And when our mortality has been clothed with immortality, then the saying of Scripture will come true: "Death is swallowed up; victory is won!"

The Rector's Corner

While walking home the other day, a little bird sang out to me – at least I think it was singing to me since there was no one else around. I stopped and looked up to where he was perched not far above my head. Again he sang out. Our eyes locked and nervously he stopped his song. I smiled to think that such a tiny thing could make such beautiful music.

As we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection, we too have a beautiful song to sing. It is a song of relief and of joy. It is the song of enduring Love and victory, of Alleluia.

*Death's mightiest powers have done their worst,
And Jesus hath His foes dispersed;
Let shouts of praise and joy outburst.
Alleluia! (Hymn 163)*

According to the bird experts, the house sparrow that sang out to me was only six inches long; and weighs approximately 34 grams -- as much as a Cadbury Crème Easter Egg. Still, its song lifted my heart to praise God.

And what about us? What about our song? As the sparrow sings of Spring, the Church proclaims new life in Christ. Christians around the world greet each other with 'Alleluia! Christ is risen!' And the reply comes back: 'He is risen indeed! Alleluia!' But the new life is not only in the future. It is much more than an insurance policy. Jesus rose again to free us from the powers of darkness now – the darkness of resentment, jealousy, anger, and every form of selfishness. In Him, we have new life characterized by faith, hope, love, patience and forgiveness.

Mark MacDonald, our National Indigenous Archbishop, describes forgiveness as "resurrection now". There is something to that because it speaks of a dead relationship being regenerated; of an impasse being overcome; of a separation being healed and communion restored. These are the effects of Jesus' victory available to you and me today – they speak of resurrection now.

Beginning on Monday, April 19th, a five week series entitled, 'How Shall We Forgive' will be presented on ZOOM. It will feature Archbishop MacDonald and our very own Archbishop David Edwards. People will be

able to attend in their own home, or at St. George's. The purpose will be to teach the mechanics – the why's and how to's – of forgiveness as given by our risen Lord.

The little birds have a song to sing and so do we!
