The quote, “God loves a cheerful giver” comes from 2nd Corinthians where Paul is commending the church in Corinth for their promised financial donation. Paul is collecting money during his travels through the Roman provinces, and he plans to deliver the offering to leaders in Jerusalem where the church is struggling. His message is this: no one should feel compelled or coerced to give, for generosity is a gift only when conducted from a willing heart. Paul also seeks to remind the church that their gifts come from God’s abundant generosity, and it is God who will continue to provide for their daily needs as well as ongoing opportunities to give.

In 2020 and early this year Bethlehem Lutheran received 4 generous donations from 3 individuals and families – including Lola Vulles, and Thelma & Vern Johnson’s estate. The total amount of these gifts was \$290,000. As a result, council was able to give \$29,000 to about twenty different local partners. (I shared with you the partners and the amounts given to each in earlier messages.) In the ensuing months, we’ve received numerous cards and notes expressing profound gratitude for our sharing. Some of the comments in those notes have been:

- *These funds will help us support our students in many ways (such as) a pair of boots for an elementary student!* - HEART Program
- *Your gift will save lives by providing a warm safe place for people.*
- Flathead Warming Center
- *Your kindness is supporting many children and parents in our community.*
- Nurturing Center
- *Your current and past support has been and is essential to our feeding program.*
- Community Kitchen, Feeding the Flathead

And the list goes on and on!!!

We also received gratitude from our partners in the Montana Synod. A note from Pastor Peggy Paugh-Leuzinger said, in part:

Thank you for sharing the abundance you have received in gifts.. Your model of generosity is inspiring. We give thanks to God for you.

Pastor Paugh-Leuzinger goes on to say that Synod leaders plan to use our giving model to encourage generosity in others. And Bishop Laurie Jungling recently expressed her thanks and gratitude via a video. I hope to share her message in church soon, but you can get a preview at our website – www.bethluth.org.

Perhaps you’ve considered a special donation to the mission of our congregation. It doesn’t have to be a “large” gift... any amount will do. Donations made through BLC – both regular tithes and special gifts – are used to serve people in Jesus’ name here in Kalispell and throughout the world. Donations are, of course, tax deductible, and there are particular tax benefits for setting aside gifts that will be distributed from your estate after you pass into the arms of Jesus. This is how Thelma and Vern made their donation, and Debbie, Brenda and others in their family will tell you how proud they are of their parents’ generosity.

Giving is an act of love in the name of the God who loves us and provides abundantly. I add my own thanks to the myriad of those already expressed. And I look forward to the ways that God will continue to bless us through opportunities to give, serve, love, and share the gospel for years to come.

BLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS
 (Meeting conducted via Zoom)
 March 9, 2021

Treasurer's Report (Duane Anderson)

- February Income \$30,694; expenditures \$34,883. Ending balance February 28th: \$33,943.

Music Ministry Report (Marshall Jones)

- Hymn sing on March 24th after midweek Lenten service.
- The virtual choir was a success; hoping to do again in April.
- No in-person choir planned until fall.
- Hymn histories continuing on Tuesdays at 4:30 p.m. via Zoom.
- Posting on Facebook some of music in new hymnal supplement All Creation Sings.

Pastor's Report (Pastor Scott Thompson)

- In person worship has a few more returning people. Would like to keep 2-group model for now. On-line worship has strong numbers regularly checking in; between 100 and over 300 views
- Introduced 'Flowers for Teachers' – donations to Maasae Girl's School instead of sanctuary lilies.
- Adding Holy Saturday to Easter schedule – an on-line Easter Vigil prerecorded and made available via website/facebook.
- Adding Easter Sunrise service at 7:00 am. Will be drive-in and/or outside seating.
- Easter worship 9 am will be radio and live stream only from the sanctuary with organ/brass/communion.

Old Business

- Duane Anderson will publish proposed Bylaw changes 60 days prior to Semi Annual Meeting.
- President Holmgren and Pastor Thompson will put together Nominating Committee for the next Council term. Committee directors need to turn in committee members staying and prospective new members.
- Pastor Thompson and Peggy Aagenes-Janzer report on Strategic Planning Team. Team learning to listen and hear things not being said. Will be opening conversation with the larger community; listening for 'what is God doing in our midst?'
- Pastor Thompson presented proposed 'Policy for Groups Gathering at BLC under COVID circumstances. Council amended proposal so that 'Groups for Teenagers' could start meeting March 10th; all other groups on April 1st.
- President Holmgren will lead small group to come up with ideas for Common Area improvements.

New Business

- Semi-Annual Meeting date was set for May 23, 2021 at 10:30 am in the Sanctuary with masks. Committee reports due before May 1st.



Virtual Choir

Thank you to those who participated in the virtual choir for “The Meditations of My Heart” . We will sing “The Lord Is My Shepherd” from Light Shines in the Darkness (which we sang a couple of years ago for Good Friday) for April 25th. GosBells, I will send something early in the summer to find out how many ringers we would have for GosBells if we start in the fall, so that I can plan accordingly.

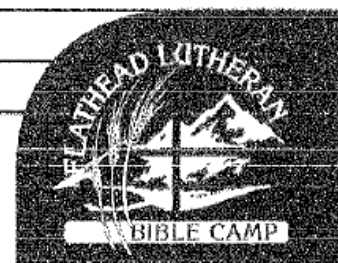
