#### **Pandemic measures**

As you will all know, we have been directed by the Synod Office not to prepare for in-person gatherings before Easter. Despite some speculation that Dr Henry may relax the Provincial Health Order before then in order to accommodate worship services, the Bishop feels that the energy it would take to prepare for gatherings and then possibly to have to switch again, is more than most communities have to spare at present. We are planning to have a range of online worship available in Holy Week, leading up to our celebration of resurrection on April 4<sup>th</sup> – though, admittedly, every Eucharist is a celebration of resurrection!

Throughout Lent we have continued our Monday to Friday noon prayers led by an ever-growing team of worship leaders.
