He has broken my bones. ⁵ He has besieged and surrounded me with anguish and distress. ⁶ He has buried me in a dark place, like those long dead. ⁷ He has walled me in, and I cannot escape. He has bound me in heavy chains. ⁸ And though I cry and shout, He has shut out my prayers. ⁹ He has blocked my way with a high stone wall; He has made my road crooked. ¹⁰ He has hidden like a bear or a lion, waiting to attack me" (NLT) Lamentations 3:17-18, "I cannot find peace; I cannot remember happiness. ¹⁸ I tell myself I am finished.
