The Nearness of God

My granddaughter Ava, 7 years old, was spending the day with me and as usual there were a lot of laughs. I love to laugh, and she definitely brings out the best in me. The silliness goes on and on! In the middle of our day she asked me a question very seriously, "Nanny, who is your best friend?" I gave it serious thought and could think of special people who have stuck with me through thick and thin. People I cannot imagine my life without, yet, in my heart I was searching for a "best friend." Who gets that title in my heart? I said to her, "Jesus." She said, "I know that Nanny, but who else?" I laughed with happiness because first of all, she knew it! Secondly, because Jesus was right there with us having fun and bringing all that joy and love he carries around and hands out to those who love him.

We don't need to make our relationship with God complicated. He provided everything for us to have a tender, loving relationship with him. How much love does God the Father have for us? Well, he loved you enough to send his Son Jesus to walk and teach you how to live. Jesus taught us how to live for the Father (John 14:31). Jesus did everything to please the Father. Jesus spoke to his disciples and told them, "If you really knew me, you would also know the Father as well." Jesus wanted them to see the Father through the very person he was.
