Second Reading: Luke 24:36b-48

Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. Blast from the Past N 24

Matang - Recipe from Maangchi

"Matang is a very delicious snack. It is chunks of fried sweet potato coated in translucent hot brown syrup. They are sweet and super crunchy on the outside and fluffy on the inside! Freshly made matang is so hot that I used to burn my tongue when I ate it."

Ingredients:

1 pound of Korean sweet potato, (Which you can find at your favourite local asian supermarket like H-Mart, Hannam or T&T) 5 cups + 1 tbsp vegetable oil,

1/4 cup of white sugar, black sesame seeds

Peel a 1 pound Korean sweet potato. Rinse it in cold water and dry it with a paper towel or cotton cloth. Slice it into chunks that look like smooth-edged triangles, about 2 inches wide and ½ inch thick. Put 5 cups of vegetable oil into a wok or frying pan and heat it up. Fry the chunks of the sweet potato over medium high heat for about 6-8 minutes until golden brown. *tip: You can tell if the oil is hot enough to fry by dipping the tip of a sweet potato chunk into it. If it bubbles, it's the right temperature to fry.

Make coating syrup:

In a thick bottomed pan, add 1 tbsp vegetable oil and spread the oil by moving the pan around. Sprinkle ¼ cup of white sugar over the oil evenly. Heat it up over medium heat for a couple of minutes. When the sugar starts melting, lower the heat and simmer for about 7-8 minutes more, until the sugar turns into a golden-brownish syrup. *tip: Never stir the syrup with a spoon; spread it by moving your pan.

Put it together:

Lay out a non-stick sheet of baking parchment. Add the fried sweet potato to the syrup in the pan. Gently mix to coat the potato chunks in the syrup. Sprinkle some black sesame seeds over top. Transfer the potato to the parchment sheet. Leave a gap between each potato piece so that they don't stick to each other. When the coating cools down and becomes solid, transfer to a serving bowl.
