But there has also been a lot of loss within the last year. It has been harder to connect. Out of love for our neighbor we have self-isolated, kept apart, postponed annual gatherings. Saying goodbye to loved ones was especially hard this past year.

We are entering into a new season at New Hope; a

season with a new pastor, a season of communal worship where we can see each other, reconnect with each other in worship. A time when most folks have been vaccinated and others are gaining comfort in reengaging in the community. I pray that includes you. What will it take for you to restart the rhythm of worship for yourself? For your family? Who might you invite to come with you? We are so grateful for the live stream but know that when you feel safe, we are ready for you to return!

Worship is not the same when you are not there. The faith community is not the same without you. The body of Christ comes together to worship, to support one another, to pray for each other and those things simply can't be done on our own. I don't know about you, but I need to hear, as much as possible, how much Jesus loves me. I need to hear that I am forgiven and that body and blood have been given for me!

The last year has not been ideal. But I am confident that Jesus walks with us. That the Holy Spirit is moving and shaking and will lead us back together. The church is the people—You are the body of Christ. All are welcome. I look forward to seeing you in worship!


YOUTH HIGHWAY CLEANUP SCHEDUED

Automatic Offering Methods

Do you have automatic withdrawals from your bank account for your monthly bills? Did you know you can also give your church offering automatically too? You can set up an automatic withdrawal from your checking/savings account and have it deposited automatically into the church account.

EFT (electronic funds transfer) forms are available in the church office. Many timely options are possible—weekly, monthly, bi-weekly. No fees associated with this method. Ask the office about more details.

Another option is PayPal. Many of you who have PayPal accounts could send your contributions through this medium. Fees apply.

And soon to come, the transition to Tithe.ly, which acts much like a PayPal account. Fees apply.

Worship Highlights for May

TRIUNF

SUNDAY SERVICES: 8:30 Hollandale—10:30 Blanchardville

SUNDAY, May 2—Fifth Sunday of Easter—This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism make us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at this table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

Readings: Act 8:26-40; Psalm 22:25-31; 1 John 4:7-12; John 15:1-8

SUNDAY, May 9—Sixth Sunday of Easter—This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

Readings: Acts 10:44-48; Psalm 98; 1 John 5:1-6; John 15:9-17

SUNDAY, May 16—Seventh Sunday of Easter—

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. The oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy spirit!


Readings: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26; Psalm 1; 1 John 5:9-13; John 17:6-19



SUNDAY, May 23, Day of Pente-cost—Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to

places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world. Readings: Acts 2:1-21; Psalm 104:24-34, 35b; Romans 8:22-27; John 15:26-27, 16:4b-15

SUNDAY, May 30—The Holy Trinity, First Sunday

SUNDAY, June 6—Time after Pentecost—A house divided against itself cannot stand. Jesus makes this observation in light of charges that he is possessed. He is possessed, not by a demon, but by the Holy Spirit. We who have received the Holy Spirit through baptism have been joined to Christ's death and resurrection and knit together in the body of Christ. Those with whom we sing and pray this day are Jesus' family. With them we go forth in peace to do the will of God.

Devotion & Prayer was led by Pastor Chris. The March Council meeting minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Ron Syse and seconded by Rodney Kurschner to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Board/committee reports were reviewed and have been submitted to the Church office.

The treasurer's report was reviewed by Becky Johnson who reported that cash wise we are sitting fairly okay. Pastor Chris' first Sunday was well attended and that was great. Having not paid a Pastor salary or benefits in the month of March was noted and helped us financially.

Old Business:

- ◆Chicken BBQ -Tiffany and Kandi gave an update regarding the Chicken dinner. To date, we have presold 125 dinners of the 200 we have ordered. Many thanks to all who have offered to help in any capacity.
- ◆Communications team—Tithe.ly update
- ◆Tiffany gave an update regarding Tithe.ly. The website is coming along nice. It is a lot to learn but things are going well. Tina Steiner has been set up for an account with Tithe.ly regarding the giving piece so we can move forward with that.
- ◆ Virtual service updates high speed internet Dawn explained that TDS has been contacted to up the speed to the higher package, to test and see if it gives us what we need to live stream and upload services. This would be an extra \$240 a year to try and make the experience better for folks via live-stream.
- ◆Communicating new information Google form feedback. Dawn discussed that a few months back the Communications team created a google form, for folks to use for anything that should be communicated out publicly (request to put in newspaper, bul-

letins, Visitor, etc). Dawn will update the Google Form. Once it is updated, it will be sent to the Council and they should begin using this form. We will also include it on the website and begin announcing it to Congregation in the upcoming months.

◆Sarah Saether has set up a new Gmail account and will communicate this with Tiffany in the near future.

New Business:

- ◆Guidelines for worshiping in person—distancing during worship—Signs will be posted at all entrances of each location to explain "Masks and social distancing encouraged". The sanctuary will be evaluated and if changes are made, they will be communicated to the church office. If changes are made, they will be communicated in the reminder email for Friday. Ushers will be asked to communicate this as well as folks come in. We will also make door signage of expectations.
- ◆ Singing—Discussion held regarding proceeding with singing in Church -Discussed asking Congregation how they feel about singing in Worship with masks on? An article (question) will be placed in the Visitor asking Congregation how they feel about proceeding with singing in Worship with masks on. Council members are encouraged to talk amongst Congregation and see how folks feel.
- ◆Communion—Discussed proceeding with Communion via continuous table vs individual chalices? Discussed that if someone is not comfortable with continuous table we will still have individual chalices for folks who choose to do this in their pew. This should be communicated for at least 2 weeks prior to making this change in Worship.
- ◆The Council decided that we will communicate out to the Congregation that as things are opening up and folks are getting vaccinated, the Council came to the conclusion that we would begin Communion via continuous table on 6/6/2021. Individual communion kits will still be available for those who choose to remain in their pews.
- ◆Acolytes—Discussed that youth had acolyte training months ago, but have not yet begun to acolyte due to COVID-19. Ron Syse suggested that we wait until fall to begin the process of acolytes again. Julie Saether suggested we invite the acolytes to start this now.
- ◆ Pastor Chris will reach out to Beth Kundert to discuss offering a refresher Acolyte class again, for all youth regardless if they have done it before or not with Pastor Chris, so that they can meet each other, and see if kids would like to sign-up to Acolyte.
- ♦ Open Doors grant discussion https://www.elca.org/ OpenDoors (applications open April 21st and close May 14th with grants awarded in Mid-June). There is a grant available by the ELCA given to churches to

help generate ministry ideas and meet new people. It is a \$1500-\$2500 Grant. Becky Johnson, Tiffany Bethke, and Gary Whitford-Holey will volunteer to submit a grant idea.
