What's Happening at CLC Cont'd

Council Summary: Of regular April Meeting + a Special Meeting the Following Tuesday

- The Nominating Committee is working on candidates for Council. If you are interested in being on Council, please contact John Laughlin at ialaughlin2@gmail.com.
- The Treasurer reported that the Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) loan was received in March and that she will be showing it as a loan liability in our budget, though she expects it to be forgiven. She also reported that the LLC had paid off this fiscal year's loan repayment obligation and may yet complete the entire loan repayment by September.
- Pastor Chad read a letter of resignation from Katie Beth. Katie Beth's seminary will no longer be offering an online option for Fall 2021, and she will need to attend classes in-person in Virginia. Her official end date will be sometime after July 31.

What could this new future look like?

Dear Partners in Mission and Ministry,

Early in the pandemic everyone was asking, "When will things get back to normal?" As a days of lockdown became weeks then months, that question became "Will things go back to normal?" Over time it evolved to "What if things don't go back to the way they were?" Now, as Spring has sprung, and we are seeing new signs of life all around us, folks are wrestling with a fourth question: "What could this new future look like?"

We are in a liminal space—we have an opportunity to create anew what *normal* looks like. On one hand, we don't want to discard the good we've found during the pandemic. On the other, "[m]oving forward calls for imagination and resilience."* Nathan Kirkpatrick of the Alban Institute, a congregational leadership venture affiliated with Duke Divinity School, summarizes our challenge well:

What could this new future look like ... is a hopeful question that gives congregations a sense of agency again. It's a truth-telling question, recognizing that all that we knew as "normal" may not be possible anymore. It's a justice-seeking question, honoring that there were elements of our past "normal" that were not holy, good or life-giving. It's a creative question that invites us to ask what's possible now.

As Pentecost—often called the birth of the Church—approaches, lean with me into this challenge. Explore where you fit in this new creation and what you have to offer. The Holy Spirit is active and present in, with, and under each of us at Christ Lutheran. And I am excited to be part of this creation with you.

On May 23rd, the day of Pentecost, we will gather to begin the work of birthing this new vision. It is the day we commit our time, talents, and treasure to the ministry and mission of this congregation for the year ahead. We invite you to bring your estimated giving cards with you to worship that day or to mail them in advance if unable to attend. Not only will we offer these with our prayers of praise and thanksgiving, but all those who attend will also receive commitment cards during worship to be offered as well. Please prayerfully consider how you will share your gifts and do contact the office if you have not received a stewardship packet and would like one.

Let us be enlivened by the opportunities of the year ahead as we work together to reveal ← the future God has planned.

Bread for the World Offering of Letters

Bread for the World's Offering of Letters is an annual letter writing and advocacy campaign to promote legislation that will work toward eliminating hunger and poverty around the world. According to the Bread for the World website (www.bread.org), "more than 270 million people are facing extreme hunger—up from 135 million before the pandemic. The levels of U.S hunger are now higher than during the Great Depression, and the social and economic impact of the pandemic continues to devastate families and communities in the U.S. and around the world."

Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which provides many avenues to help people struggling with hunger and poverty. This year's Offering of Letters campaigns for the provisions of this legislation addressing hunger to be made permanent, along with making the United States the world leader for providing resources and programs to help eradicate hunger around the world. Four years ago the Equity and Justice committee sent a letter to the editors of the local papers stating "We write in anguish over the injustice of police violence against people of color." Within 18 days of the start of the trial of Derek Chauvin in March 2021, at least 64 people died at the hands of law enforcement nationwide, with Black and Latino people representing more than half of the dead. The average was more than three killings a day. (NYT) This is a complicated topic. How do we process this information? How do we as Christians respond? Come share your feelings and ideas, or come to just listen.

Advocacy Corner

Calling Lutherans to Advocate for the Equality Act

The House has passed the bipartisan Equality Act (H.R. 5), a bill that would add sexual orientation and gender identity as protected classes alongside race, gender, religion, national origin, age, and disability. Now we need to urge the Senate to introduce and pass an amended version of this legislation too.



Christ Lutheran is part of the Reconciling Ministries Network

The ELCA supports equal rights for our LGBTQIA+ siblings. The ELCA's social Reconciling Ministries Netwo statement *Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust* states that the "dignity of the human being reflects God's deep love and stands against all forms of violence, discrimination, and injustice".

We now have the opportunity to urge adoption of legislation that ensures the full rights of LGBTQIA+ persons. We do so as a church that affirms the conscience-bound diversity of beliefs across the ELCA, and we do so mindful of possible impacts of this legislation on religious liberty. Concern is expressed that the current version of this legislation could open the door to future improper government interference in the ecclesiastical activities of religious organizations. Read more about these concerns in the blog "<u>Equal Rights and Religious Freedom</u>." Affirming our conscience-bound diversity and aware of the need of religious freedom, support for an amended version of the Equality Act is consistent with ELCA priorities.

Now is the time to add our clear and faithful Lutheran voices to make long overdue inclusions to federal law. You can send a customized letter to your Senators now through the ELCA Action Center.
