## WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT OUR HEAVENLY FATHER?

We learn Trinitarianism by <u>RELATING</u>, understanding and <u>RESPONDING</u> to a well-defined picture of God the Father, a well-defined picture of God the Son, and a well-defined picture of God the Holy Spirit.

## 1. God the Father is the <u>ULTIMATE</u> and <u>INTENDED</u> Father.

Ephesians 3:14 (NASB) For this reason [On account of this] I [continually] bow my knees [in worship] before the Father, <sup>15</sup> from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name [character, significance, reputation]...

## 2. God the Father is to be <u>SET APART</u>.

Matthew 6:5 (NASB) "When you pray, you are not to be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners so that they may be seen by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full."

Matthew 6:9 (NASB) "Our Father who is [the one] in heaven, hallowed be Your name [Let Your character, works and reputation be set apart]."
3. God the Father is the only one we should <u>CALL</u> Father.
Matthew 23:8 (NASB) "But do not be called Rabbi; for One is your Teacher, and you are all brothers. <sup>9</sup> Do not call anyone on earth your father; for One is your Father, He who is in heaven. <sup>10</sup> Do not be called leaders; for One is your Leader, that is, Christ."
WHAT DOES THIS FATHER DO?
1. God the Father <u>DEFINES</u> our acceptance.
Romans 5:8 (NASB) But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
2. God the Father <u>DEMONSTRATES</u> His love.
Romans 8:31 (NASB) What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us [on our behalf], who is against us? <sup>32</sup> He [indeed] who did not spare His own [unique] Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely [graciously] give us all things?
3. God the Father <u>JUSTIFIES</u> us [Declares us in a right relationship with Him].
Romans 8:33 (NASB) Who will bring a [legal or legitimate] charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies [continually makes us in a right relationship with Him]
