Congregational Theme/Story Time

Are you my mother? Am I yours? What are y/our stories about mothers - animal mothers, makebelieve moms and real moms. Today we celebrate giving love. Giving birth is one kind of mothering. Giving and receiving love takes all kinds!

Bible Readings ~

- Corinthians 13:4-7~ Love is patient; love is kind. Love is not jealous, it does not put on airs, and it is not snobbish; it is never rude or self-seeking; it is not prone to anger, nor does it brood over injuries. Love doesn't rejoice in what is wrong but rejoices in the truth. There is no limit to love's forbearance, to its trust, its hope, its power to endure.
- ➤ **Isaiah 49:14-15** ~ But Zion said, 'God has abandoned me, God has forgotten me.' Does a woman forget her baby at the breast, or fail to cherish the child of her womb? Yet even if these forget, I will never forget you.
- ➤ Psalm 139:13-14 ~ For you formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well.
- Luke 2:19-20 & 50-52 ~ Mary treasured all these things and reflected on them on her heart. The shepherds went away glorifying and praise God for all they had heard and seen, just as they had been told.But they didn't understand what he told them. Then Jesus went down with them to Nazareth and was obedient to them. Mary stored these things in her heart, and Jesus grew in wisdom, in years and in favour with God and people alike.
- ➤ Ruth 1:11,14, 16-17 ~ (All we know about Ruth's own mother, is that after her husband, Mahlon, died, Ruth didn't go back to her mother/family. Instead, she clung to her mother-in-law.) But Naomi said to them. "Go back, my daughters. Why do you want to come with me? I have no more sons inside me that you can take as spouses." ... And once more they wept loudly. Then Orpah kissed Naomi and returned to her people. But Ruth stayed by her side. ...Ruth insisted, "Please don't ask me to leave you and turn away from your company. I swear to you: Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge. Your people will be my people, and your God, my God. Where you die, I'll die there too, and I will be buried there beside you. I swear may God be my witness and judge that not even death will keep us apart."
- ➤ 1 Peter 3:3-5 ~ Dress modestly, and not for show without fancy hairstyles, gold jewelry or fine apparel. Your attractiveness should reside inside, in the heart, with the imperishable quality of a gentle and calm disposition, which is precious in the sight of God. We have the example of holy people of ages past who hoped in God and were attractive because of their humility.

Prayers of the Day

All-encompassing God, we pray for those who feel excluded when we emphasis one kind of family as normal.

We remember Esther, who was adopted and raised by her cousin. God who embraces us all, we pray for those who cannot be raised by their parents, for a short time or permanently.

We remember Jochebed, the mother of Moses, who placed him into a raft on the river.

Saving God,
we pray for parents who struggle to raise their children
in oppressive circumstances.

We remember Hannah, who loved her child so much she handed him over to another to raise.

Loving God, we pray for parents who have placed their child in another family.

We remember Naomi, who grieved the death of her sons. God, who grieves with us, we pray for parents who mourn the death of a child.

We remember Ruth, who gave up her family to be family to another. Inclusive God, we pray for those who choose to be family to those isolated by culture or language or distance. We remember Elizabeth, who had a child in old age and we remember Mary, who had a child as a teenager.

Ageless God, we pray that as a community we accept people of varying life stages and responsibilities and relationships.

We remember Rachel, crying for her children God of justice and hope, we pray for those whose children are killed, and look to a time when children can live safely in their communities.

We remember Lois and Eunice, who taught Timothy faith by example. Faithful God, we pray for those who teach us faith by their lives, may we remember that we also teach about you in the way we live.

We remember other people not named in the Scriptures, like the mother of the prodigal son. Companion God, we pray for those who wait for a phone call or a visit, cut off from family and friends by distance and disagreement.

Nurturing God, we give thanks for those who enrich our lives by their presence who teach us about your abundant love who encourage us to journey in faith.
