SCRIPTURE

I will make roads through all the mountains and raise up highways. For behold, your loved ones are returning home. They on their way from afar, some from the north or west, others from a city in the east or south.

The choirs sing, Shout for joy, you heavens! Exalt, you earth! Mountains, break into song! For God comforts those whom God created, and has compassion on those who are suffering.

But the people say, 'God has abandoned me, *Adonai* has forgotten me.'

God replies,

What? Does a woman forget her baby at her breast? Or fail to cherish the child that she has birthed? Yet even if mothers do forget their children, I will never forget you.

Look and see:

I have inscribed your name on the palms of my hands, I know you. I keep watch as you rebuild your life.

I Will Never Forget You

As I said earlier, this worship was crafted with the United Church Women, and it was a wonderful experience being part of a team that put this service together. We via Zoom, the women brought themes, and favourite hymns, and prayers . . . even the photograph of the hands was contributed by one from her visit to Ireland.

This teamwork is something that I would like to experience again, and I will be extending an invitation for those who would like to craft a summer worship with me, so if you are interested, keep your eye on the Friday letter or send me an email.

One of the directions I was given was to keep the sermon "short and sweet." And so, in obedience to these wise women, I shall.

We hear in today's passage from Isaiah --- that was in response to the Hebrew people of God being in exile and isolation and captivity, (similar to how some of us feel as prisoners of this pandemic and under "house arrest" and in isolation . . . even desperation!) --- these words attributed to God:

"Does a woman forget her baby at her breast?

Or fail to cherish the child that she has birthed?

Yet even if mothers do forget their children, I will never forget you."

How wisely said:

There is a concept in psychotherapy, "The Good Enough Mother," for as hard as we try, we are imperfect and don't always get the mothering part right.

And some mothers, have issues that prevent good mothering, and children and offspring suffer . . .

So, today's passage covers the good, the good-enough, and the not-so-good of mothering, the cherishing and the failure to cherish . . .

This scripture clearly and boldly states:

"Even if you feel abandoned, I will not forget you. I will never forget you. See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands."

(pause)

Would you take a moment and look at your hands . . .

(pause)

Can you feel the intent of God's words specifically for you?

"I will never forget you . . . I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands. I know you. I keep watch and rebuild your life."

Today as you live this day, every time you notice your hands . . . as you eat your lunch . . . and wash your hands, as you perhaps pull some weeds . . . or knit . . . or use a tool to fix something . . . or type on the computer or tap a number on a phone . . .

Every time you notice your hands, remember these words . . .

"I will never forget you . . . I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands".

And embrace the love of God that will not let you go.

"Is this short and sweet enough?" Amen

THE GIFT OF UNITED CHURCH WOMEN

Brief History:

In 1962 the UCW (United Church Women) was created as the successor to the Woman's Missionary Society (WMS), a world mission-oriented service and study group that supported almost 100 active missionaries around the world. The Woman's Association (WA) at that time focused on work in the local church and community. Guilds and Ladies' Aids were the WA's forerunners; in the early years, these units went unrecorded, just doing what needed to be done, spiritually, financially, and socially.

Today, that spirit of generosity continues in active UCWs in Communities of Faith and from coast to coast to coast, united in expressing their devotion to Jesus Christ in Christian witness, study, fellowship, and service.

The Vision of the UCW:

As women of faith, we believe in nurturing Christian spirituality by reaching out through commitment and devotion to all God's people in the promotion of truth, justice, peace, caring, and respect for all throughout the earth, God's world.

We believe in honouring God the Creator, and loving others through generous giving and joyful living; one of the ministries of the UCW is to support summer camps for children.

And we believe in affirming and strengthening ourselves both individually and together through creative study, prayer, and action.
