News from Parish Council

At our May 16 monthly meeting parish council had an opportunity to learn about a decision making process that helps to provide a ‘reality check’ on any idea we may consider.

George Wagner reported that the bathroom fans are now working and he will be activating the sprinkler system this week.

Jane Jennings visited to introduce a proposed library policy which was passed.

We discussed the draft letter for the City of Campbell River which will be part of our application for the property tax exemption.

Tony Smith reported positive comments received on music provided by Georgia Smith and Kate Fitzsimmons.

Lois reported that there are seven 12 Step groups meeting in our hall now. These meetings are deemed an essential service.

We planned for a recognition of our graduates.

PWRDF is responding to an urgent appeal from the newly installed Archbishop of Jerusalem, Hosam Naoum, with funds for Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza, with a grant of \$10,000.

The funds will assist with running generators and purchasing medicine and supplies to meet the crushing flow of injured and traumatized victims in this conflict. He also requests our prayers.

If you wish to assist go to pwrdf.org/give-today and click on Emergency Response and mention Gaza Hospital. You can also make your offering through the church using your envelope.

The foodbank needs our support. Non-perishable foods, baby food and formula, diapers, sanitary products for women. Or money. You can give in kind through the church and your financial donations can go through the church or direct to the food bank. You will get a tax receipt in either case.

Grass Roots, Kind Hearts feeds people who are in need: any meal feels good when you are hungry. Diana Hicks and her team work hard on this ministry, talk to her to offer help, give money to the church to buy food and other necessities.

Proposed Labyrinth

Since the Annual Meeting in February there has been conversation about the possibility of a labyrinth on the church grounds. This would serve the needs of parish members in meditation and be available to people from the community as well. At our Parish Council Meeting on May 16 a proposal was brought forward by David Fitzsimmons.

According to the proposal the labyrinth would suit the site by the offices and be 30 feet across. The cost would be about \$1000 for materials. A bench could be added for those who would like to sit to pray.

It could be a summer project for the parish where people could work together in a socially distanced environment to build the labyrinth.

A labyrinth is a classic meditation space. It is a place to make a symbolic pilgrimage, if you can't make a real one.

Parish Council is looking for 20 families to make a donation of money or time to the project. Will you be one?
