Introductory words

A candle may be lit, to set apart this time of prayer.

Opening Hymn

Opening Sentence

Officiant: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful; and kindle in us the fire of your love.

Officiant: Lord, open our lips

Response: **And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

Officiant: God's love has been poured into our hearts.

Response: **We dwell in God and God dwells in us.**

Officiant: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Response: **as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.**

Alleluia!

The Invitatory

Officiant: You send forth your Spirit, O Lord; you renew the face of the earth.

O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

All of them look to you to give them their food in due season.

You give it to them; they gather it; you open your hand, and they are filled with good things.

May the glory of the Lord endure for ever; may the Lord rejoice in all his works. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Officiant: You send forth your Spirit, O Lord; you renew the face of the earth.

The Proclamation of the Word

Old Testament Lesson

at the end of the reading

Reader: The Word of the Lord

Response: **Thanks Be to God.**

Psalm (read responsively by the half verse)

at the end of the psalm

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit

Response: **As it was in the beginning, is now and will be for ever. Amen.**

New Testament Lesson

at the end of the reading

Reader: The Word of the Lord

Response: **Thanks Be to God.**

Gospeller: The Lord be with you.

Response: **And also with you.**

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to...

Response: **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

at the end of the gospel reading

Gospeller: The Gospel of Christ

Response: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Sermon

The Baptismal Covenant

Officiant: Let us commit ourselves anew to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Officiant: Do you believe in God the Father?

Response: **I believe in God,**

The Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Officiant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Response: **I believe in Jesus Christ,**

his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

**He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.**

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Officiant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Response: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Officiant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Response: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

Response: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

Response: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

Response: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

Response: I will, with God's help.

Officiant: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

Response: I will, with God's help.

The Lord's Prayer

Officiant: And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,
**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come,
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.**

Response: Amen.

Doxology

Officiant: Glory to God
whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.
Glory to God from generation to generation,
in the Church and in Christ Jesus, for ever and ever.

Response: Amen.

Officiant: May the grace of the Holy Spirit enlighten our hearts and minds.

Response: Amen.

Officiant: Closing Blessing

Response: Amen. Alleluia!

If a candle was lit, it is extinguished now.
