FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-8

This liturgical text invites the church and all creation to sing in praise of God's glory. That glory is God's mercy toward sinners.

¹In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;
the whole earth is full of his glory."

⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Jesus' miracles prompt Nicodemus to visit him in secrecy. Jesus tells him about being born of the Spirit and about the Son who has been sent by God to save.

¹Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a

teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹“Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

Outdoor Worship begins on Sunday, June 6 at 9:30 AM

Zoom worship will still continue every Sunday at 9:30 AM

As we prepare for outdoor worship on June 6, here's what you need to know:

- Worship will be held in the grassy area in front of the playground. Please park in the back lot or the side lot.
- We invite you to bring your own lawn chairs for worship, but we will have folding metal chairs from the fellowship hall available for anyone who needs one.
- We ask that you wear your mask anytime you are moving and in close proximity to others – walking to the worship area, greeting people, returning to your vehicle at the end of worship. Once you are seated and worship is taking place, you may remove your mask if you feel comfortable doing so. Please recognize some folks may choose to remain masked, especially when singing.
- We ask that you social distance when you set up where you will sit – please be sure there is at least 6 feet of distance between you and anyone else who has already set up their chairs.
- Bulletins will be on a table as you enter the worship area – please take one for each member of your family.
- There will be two speakers used to provide adequate audio of the service outside. Folks who might have difficulty hearing normally should sit closer to one of the speakers.
- At the conclusion of worship, any trash or used bulletins may be discarded in the trash and recycling receptacles by the table.
- We will still be providing online worship at the same time for anyone who is unable or not ready to be in-person so, please understand that someone will be sitting near the front of the worship area with a tripod to provide video feed for the live-stream.

- lawn chairs
- your mask
- your offering
- an open heart and spirit

This outdoor service that is being live-streamed is a whole new set up for our tech team and staff – we know there may be glitches that we could not predict. Please be patient with us as we work out those glitches both online and in-person in the early weeks as we do our best to provide a worshipful experience for all.

In the event of inclement weather

Please call the church and listen to the outgoing message and/or check the website for changes to outdoor worship. In the event that outdoor worship is not feasible, the service will be live-streamed on Zoom from within the sanctuary. Anybody who is unable to connect on Zoom from home is welcome to come to the church and sit in your car in the parking lot to listen to the worship service on your car radio – tune in at FM 89.5.

- A picture of the graduate



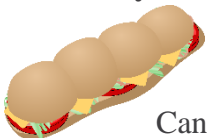

The unforgettable story of four orphans who travel the Mississippi River on a life-changing odyssey during the Great Depression. In the summer of 1932, on the banks of Minnesota's Gilead River, Odie O'Banion is an orphan confined to the Lincoln Indian Training School, a pitiless place where his lively nature earns him the superintendent's wrath. Forced to flee after committing a terrible crime, he and his brother, Albert, their best friend, Mose, and a brokenhearted little girl named Emmy steal away in a canoe, heading for the mighty Mississippi and a place to call their own.
