

Welcome and Introduction (The Rev. Daniel Fournier)

Priest: This powerful feast tells us about the early church, but it is also a clarion call for us as a community and as individuals.

The images of fire, wind, breath, and a cacophony of voices are meant to evoke a collective "fire in the belly" that motivates us to do what we are called to do.

Today we are assured that the Spirit is with us, as it was with them on that first enlivening Pentecost.
