Grace mercy and peace, dear friends in Christ,

"3 Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love. 4 It has given me great joy to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as the Father commanded us. 5 And now, dear lady, I am not writing you a new command but one we have had from the beginning. I ask that we love one another. 6 And this is love: that we walk in obedience to his commands. As you have heard from the beginning, his command is that you walk in love." (2 John v3-6)

These words written by Saint John have never meant so much to us as they do now.

As the United States and the world recovers, we ask for God's grace, peace, and mercy. Every day, in good seasons and bad, we should ask because that indicates that we are in need of such grace, peace, and mercy. Why? We should ask because we often lack these things in our daily lives and in our interactions with others.

John's letter is a matter of what is required because of what God has done for us in Christ Jesus. God has given us His Son, and through our faith in His Son, we now live out that faith toward others.

The orange tree naturally bears oranges, while the Christian bears love towards his neighbor. Just as the orange tree needs water and nutrients, the same is true with the Christian. The Christian, throughout his life, needs to be fed the word of God. To be fed the word made flesh which is Christ. Without the nutrients of word and sacraments, we become weak and frail. If you know someone who is suffering, give them a call or better yet sit and talk with them to encourage them, and you will be encouraged.

Love one another by being patient and kind, slow to anger, and not keeping a record of wrongs. At times loving your neighbor is easy, and sometimes it is a little harder. Keep working toward that perfect love God the Father in Christ Jesus has for us. But remember loving your neighbor is an expression of your faith in Christ and it is a response to what God has done for us in Christ Jesus.

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace."

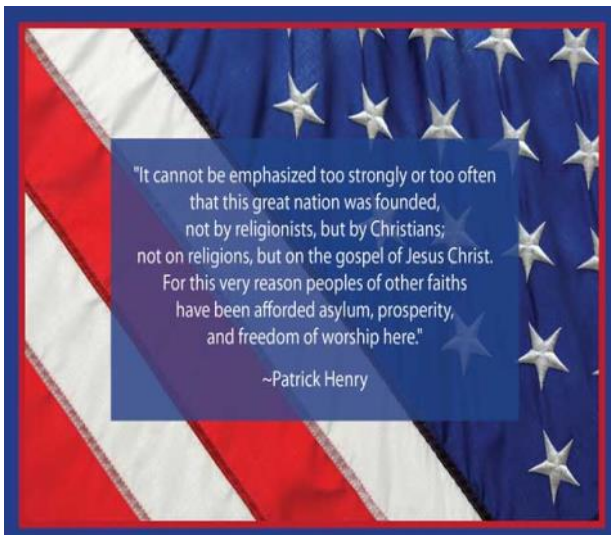

Ushers Needed

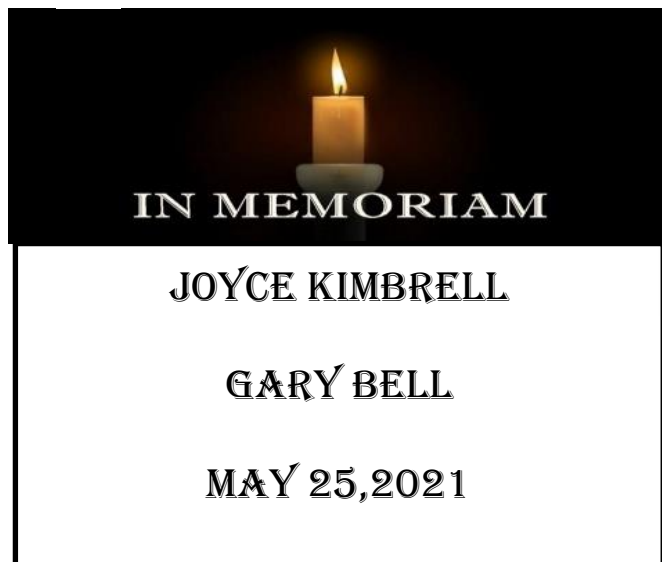
