REPORT of CHURCH COUNCIL - May 10, 2021

Starting on Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd, worshipers can come to the communion rail to receive the body of Christ. This is another step forward in getting back to our customary way of distribution for communion. Ushers will direct members in lining up in the aisle and moving forward. Information informing worshipers of this change will appear in the May 16th & May 23rd Weekly Call and bulletins.

Women of the ELCA held their Day of Renewal at Camp Nawakwa on Saturday, May 8th. The day was enjoyed by all in attendance. The May meeting will be held next Wednesday, May 19th in Fellowship Hall. All women are welcomed to join in the gathering.

Church Property reported that the heat sensors are on back order. Teleplus will schedule the date to install them when they receive the sensors from their supplier. The Finance Ministry reported that the Teleplus contract was renewed at a cost of \$2,007.38. The use of BCM Payroll Services in Chambersburg will begin July 1st at a cost of \$2,035.00. This will be for direct deposit of employee paychecks. It was noted that by contracting for this service the church will no longer need to purchase the annual payroll software and Quick-Books' updates. This will offset the expense for BCM Payroll Services making the cost \$1,000. The request by Jean Goldthorpe for the annual SpiriTrust Lutheran Auxiliary Membership drive was approved. The drive is held from mid-May through June.

Devin Wilson will receive the Eldon & Evelyn McCracken Award at our worship service Sunday, June 6th. The award is presented to a high school graduate for his/her service to Memorial Lutheran. Since Covid interrupted Confirmation instruction, like so many other things, Pastor Carnes has suggested that we hold Confirmation on Reformation Sunday, October 31st.

The Covid-19 Task Force shared recommendations from its April meetings. Included in the recommendations are: Sunday School classes should resume in September; the preschool will continue with its schedule of two four-hour classes; and in agreement with the Worship & Music Ministry's recommendations, Sunday worship services will continue through the summer at 10:00 am, and our customary practices for communion will resume as directed by Pastor Carnes. The use of the Parlor for funerals is deemed safe at this time. The wearing of face masks and social distancing should still be observed. Also recommended was to start the process of reopening our church kitchen. The task force feels that it will be safe for up to six people to prepare food in the kitchen following current protocols as closely as possible. The statement also strongly recommends that all those working in the kitchen be vaccinated to make it as safe as possible to work without wearing face masks. Food preparation would be limited for take-out or pick-up only. Serving and eating in Fellowship Hall is still prohibited until further notice.

We missed the opportunity to have a voice and a vote at our Synod Assembly in June. It is disappointing that no one came forward to represent Memorial from our membership. Perhaps the having it online and requiring some specialized technology skills intimidated would be volunteers. Hopefully, next year the assembly can be held in person. Pastor Carnes will be attending and can share information from the conference.

There are always opportunities to serve your church. Some are on-going, some may be for a one-time specific need. Our preschool is need of a treasurer. If you can share your skills and time in this ministry, please contact Shirley Perry (preschoolmlc@gmail.com), Andy McCole or leave your name with the church office. Teachers for Sunday School are needed. If you have this calling, talk with the Pastor. You will need to have a background clearance done to work with/around children and youth. (Amy can help you with that information.)

The devotions at our May Council meeting were taken from the book of Isaiah chapter 6. These reflections were shared: "God never asks of our availability. The raw material isn't important. It is how it is used." May we remember this verse and do the same. "And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, 'Here I am, send me." (Isaiah 6:8)
