Read: **Acts 8:26-40**

Question: Who do you think this story is really about?

Note: Chapter 8 begins by telling us that the believers that were scattered, left Jerusalem, and preached the good news about Jesus everywhere they went.

Question: Persecution intended to slow down the work increased their witness. How would that be possible?

Question: In what way does the baptism of the Holy Spirit empower a Christian for witness?

Read Acts 8:26.

Note: Philip allowed Himself to be led. Philip had matured in his life and ministry, to a point of being able to be led by God.

Question: What does it mean to be led by the spirit?

Question: Can you describe a time you were led by the spirit?

Note: The Holy Spirit has so much to say to both Christians and non-Christians. Both Philip and the Ethiopian were listening and obeying the Holy Spirit. These two met on the road. They had travelled along way to meet up.
