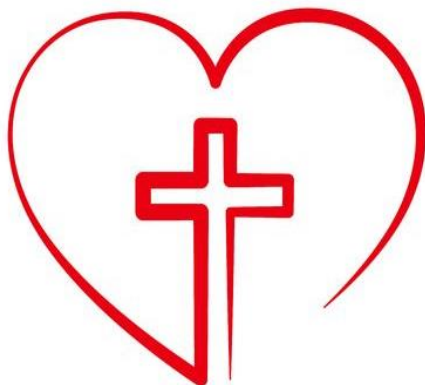

Confession

Celebrant: The coming of Christ was not,
