




Jesus loves the little children

Things to consider

Laying on of hands

- Blessing
 - Healing
- Consecration to the Lord



Children were important to Jesus

 - Held them close



Children were important to the parents

- Felt the love of Jesus
- Felt the love of their parents

This comes with a warning!




Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it."
