He will be filled with the Holy Spirit, ever before his birth. <sup>16</sup> And he will turn many Israelites to the Lord their God. <sup>17</sup> He will be a man with the spirit and power of Elijah. He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and he will cause those who are rebellious to accept the wisdom of the godly. <sup>18</sup> Zechariah said to the angel, `How can I be sure this will happen? † <u>John 11:3-7</u>, "So the two sisters sent a message to Jesus telling Him, `Lord, Your dear friend is very sick.' <sup>4</sup>But when Jesus heard about it He said, "Lazarus's sickness will not end in death. No, it happened for the glory of God so that the Son of God will receive glory from this.' <sup>5</sup>So although Jesus loved Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, <sup>6</sup>He stayed where He was for the next two days. <sup>7</sup>Finally, He said to His disciples, `Let's go back to Judea'" (NLT).

John 11:14b-15, 17. Jesus said, "Lazarus is dead. 15And for your sakes, I'm glad I wasn't there, for now you will really believe. Come, let's go see him"... 17When Jesus arrived at Bethany, He was told that Lazarus had already been in his grave for four days" (NLT). Not Allowing God To Get The Glory Will Cause In Us: † John 11:21-26, "Martha said to Jesus, `Lord, if only You had been here, my brother would not have died. <sup>22</sup>But even now I know that God will give You whatever you ask.' 23 Jesus told her, 'Your brother will rise again.' 24' Yes, "'Martha said, 'he will rise when everyone else rises, at the last day.' 25Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Anyone who believes in Me will live, even after dying. 26Everyone who lives in Me and believes in Me will never ever die. Do you believe this, Martha?" (NLT). † John 11:32, "Mary said to Jesus, `Lord, if only You had been here, my brother would not have died" (NLT). † John 11:34-44, ""`Where have you put him?' Jesus asked them. They told Him, `Lord, come and see.' 35Then Jesus wept. 36The people who were standing nearby said, 'See how much He loved him!' 37But some said, `This man healed a blind man. Couldn't He have kept Lazarus from dying?' 38 Jesus was still angry as He arrived at the tomb, a cave with a stone rolled across its entrance. 39 Roll the stone aside, Jesus told them. But Martha, the dead man's sister, protested, `Lord, he has been dead for four days. The smell will be terrible' 40 Jesus responded. 'Didn't I tell you that you would see God's glory if you believe?' 41So they rolled the stone aside. Then Jesus looked up to heaven and said, `Father, thank You for hearing Me. 42You always hear Me, but I said it out loud for the sake of all these people standing here, so that they will believe You sent Me.' 43Then Jesus shouted, `Lazarus, come out!' 44And the dead man came out, his hands and feet bound in grave-clothes, his face wrapped in a head-cloth. Jesus told them, `Unwrap him and let him go!" (NLT). Be willing to accept that God has a \_\_\_\_\_\_ than my \_\_\_\_\_. † Mark 5:22b-23, "When Jarius saw Jesus, he fell at his feet, <sup>23</sup>pleading fervently with Him. `My little daughter is dying,' he said. `Please come and lay Your hands on her; heal her so she can live'" (NLT). Mark 5:30, "Jesus realized at once that healing power had gone out from Him, so He turned around in the crowd and asked, `Who touched my robe?'" (NLT). Mark 5:35-36, "While he was still speaking to her, messengers arrived from the home of Jairus, the leader of the synagogue. They told him, 'Your daughter is dead. There's no use troubling the Teacher now.' 36 But Jesus overheard them and said to Jairus, 'Don't be afraid. Just have faith'" (NLT). Two Important Points To Remember From the Story of Jarius: a. While you are waiting for God to answer your prayer, keep your eyes open to see \_\_\_\_\_ of God's power in other people's lives. b. God delays in answering our prayers at times to \_ c. Read the story of Joseph in the Old Testament in Genesis 37-50. God had to get Joseph to be a prisoner in Egypt before he could become Prime Minister over Egypt. Romans 1:7, 10, 15, "I am writing to all of you in Rome who are loved by God and are called to be His own holy people . . . 10One of the things I always pray for is the opportunity, God willing, to come at last to see you . . . 15So I am eager to come to you in Rome, too, to preach the Good News" (NLT). Romans 15:20, 24, "My ambition has always been to preach the Good News where the name of Christ has never been heard, rather than where a church has already been started by someone else . . . 24I am planning to go to Spain, and when I do, I will stop off in Rome. And after I have enjoyed your fellowship for a little while, you can provide for my journey" (NLT). Acts 28:16, "When we arrived in Rome, Paul was permitted to have his own private lodging, though he was guarded by a soldier" (NLT). Philippians 1:13, "My imprisonment in the cause of Christ has become common knowledge throughout the whole praetorian (imperial) guard and to everyone else" (AMP).
