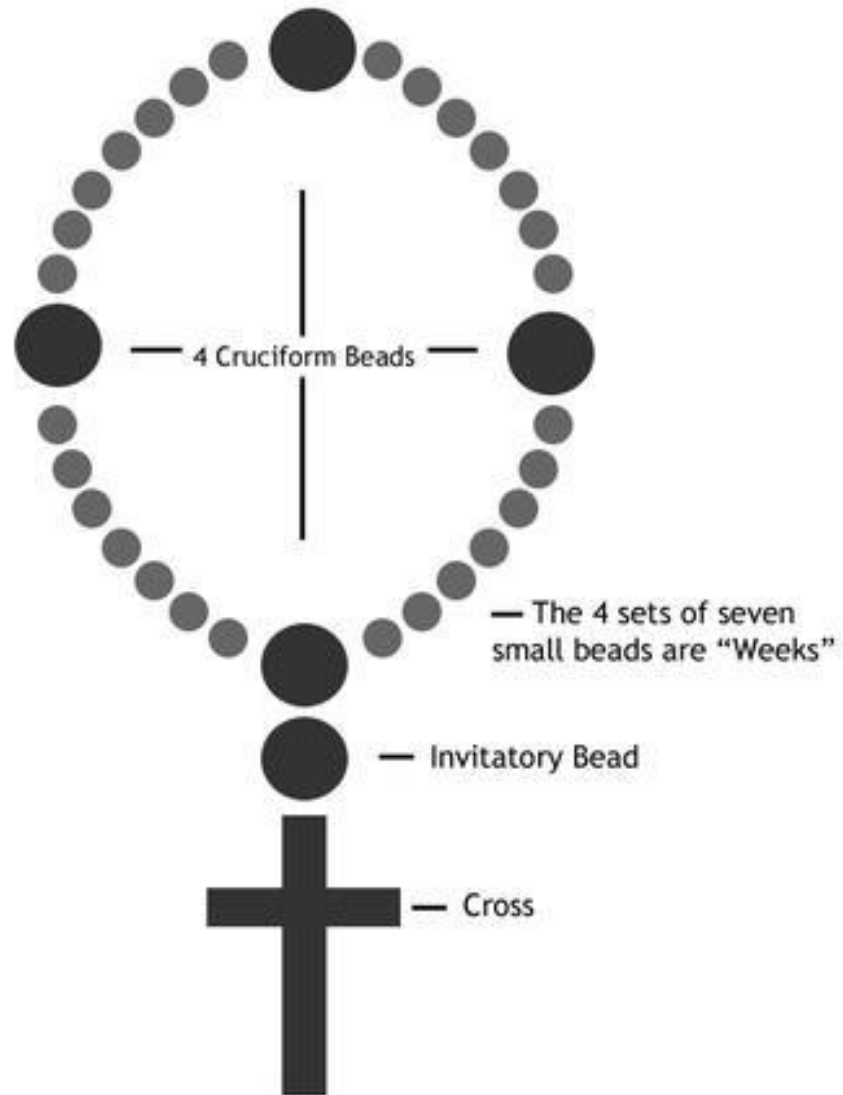

St. Patrick's Breastplate

Cross

I bind unto myself the strong name of the Trinity,
by invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three.

Invitatory (or Intention)

[Express your intention in praying this rosary]

Cruciform

Christ be with me. Christ within me.

Christ behind me. Christ before me.

Christ beside me. Christ to win me.

Christ to comfort and restore me.

Christ beneath me. Christ above me.

Christ in quiet. Christ in danger.

Christ in hearts of all that love me.

Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

Dismissary (on the Invitatory bead)

I bind unto myself today
The power of God to hold and lead,
His eye to watch, his might to stay,

His hand to guide, his shield to ward;
The Word of God to give me speech,
His heavenly host to be my guard.

Cross

In the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen

Yours is the day, O God, yours also the night;

Invitatory (or Intention)

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

Cruciform

and asleep we may rest in peace.

Weeks
