WORKSHOPS FOR YOUTH & PARENTS TO FOLLOW AFTER DINNER



As required by Victoria Health we need to keep a record of who has been attending the church service. We have set up a QR code that you can scan when you arrive at church on which your basic information will be captured securely onto a form in Elvanto.

We will only use or disclose your check-in information for coronavirus (COVID-19) contact tracing. Your data will then be deleted after 28 days. Your details won't be used for marketing or other purposes.

We will also have some volunteers with iPads to assist people who are unable to check in using their phones. It may take a bit of time to get everyone through the process so please try to be a bit earlier at church than what you would normally be.

On Monday the 3rd of May, I received a couple of calls regarding a request for help from a local mission.

The Dining Room Mission or TDR Mission, (<u>www.tdrmission.org.au</u>,) is a local community meal service providing food to homeless people and to struggling families. They run every Tuesday evening from 5:30 -7:00 and are located in the back hall of the St John the Divine Anglican Church, Toorak Avenue, Croydon. They have been running this service since 2005.

Mike and I visited TDR Mission on Tuesday the 4th of May. We spoke to Jack Merx. He indicated that what he was looking for was a team of people from our congregation to prepare two course meals



(main meal and dessert) for approximately 60 people, once a month. We would need to make simple meals that could be heated or reheated on the fourth Tuesday night of every month, and the meals would be packaged and served hot to whomever comes in. Because of Covid at the moment there is not the opportunity to sit down in the hall to eat the meals, the people that came in took enough for themselves and their families and ate them at home or in their cars etc.

The Deacons and I would love to hear from you and gauge whether we can get enough commitment from the congregation to join the TDR Mission.

For us, this will be a very practical way of service in our local community. It is also a form of equipping us to step out in faith and proclaim Christ.

- Please pray for Mia and Hennie's friend Herman in South Africa struck down by the corona virus and his wife Henriette and children as well as all those who are in a similar situation. Pray for swift healing.
- Please pray for the marriage relationships within our church community, pray that the evil one will
 not gain a foothold between spouses but that we will be prepared to sacrifice ourselves for each
 other.
- Please pray for our nation, pray for those affected by the mouse plague currently devastating farming communities in NSW and Queensland.

Please pray for God's church in Afghanistan. Afghanistan, from which the 9/11 attacks and other terror plots were launched 20 years ago, could again fall into the hands of the Taliban. This call to prayer comes from a Christian within Afghanistan who has given decades of his life along with his team to serve the country and its long suffering people. "The US and NATO (and indeed Australia) have decided to pull out all troops by September. The Afghan people were shocked by this decision and even worse that this is being done without any conditions required of the Taliban. It was clear before and has become now even more evident now that the Afghan Army strongly needs help to defend our country. The Afghan government reports since the troop withdrawals were announced that the Taliban has increased its control to 104 districts across Afghanistan.

Targeted killings have risen. The vehicle of a close brother of one of our believers was blown up and he just escaped where all the other passengers burnt to death. One of our local worker's relatives returned from a wedding to their home when the Taliban stopped their bus, took six young people out and killed them in front of the eyes of all their relatives. While ten determiners were recently killed, probably by Islamic State, today it was reported that five polio vaccinators were killed and four injured by the Taliban. There have been power cuts in the capital as the Taliban blew up power lines. It has been reported that 28 antennas have been destroyed which makes communication extremely difficult. We would like to ask for fervent pray for Afghanistan, that God would step in and save this nation from being captured and governed again by the Taliban.

Please pray with us that:


- * The government as well as the army will stay united, and for wisdom in all their decisions.

BUDGET UPDATE

Funds in: March was a better month in terms of offerings and funds received into our church bank account.

Expenses: Payments for the month were much higher than budget, primarily due to some arrears CRC Australia ministry share contributions that were brought up to date. The year-to-date expenses as reported is now reasonably accurate and mostly in line with budget.

Shortfall: Our year-to-date cash shortfall is about \$25k, marginally better than budget. This means y.t.d. we have drawn down on or depleted our cash resources to the amount of about \$25,000.
