## Parish Events

Parish Council has set Aug. 8 as the date for us to resume in-person Services (assuming the Provincial reopening plan stays on track). There won't be a limit on numbers, but "distancing" pictures will be placed on alternating rows of pews, which will limit seating to 100. No registration will be required. Mask-wearing will be mandatory for the month of Aug., and then re-evaluated. In-person Sunday School will resume in Sep. The Services will continue to be live-streamed.

We share tips, teach and enjoy fellowship. If you are unable to attend meetings, but would still like to take part, you can make your shawls at home. **What makes each quilt or shawl special** is the fact that prayer is symbolically tied into each one.
