Present and Future Property Development:



In 2019 we shepherded a project to install a 72 niche columbarium and Bishop Ford Memorial Garden which serve as an integral centre piece to the pastoral ministry begun by Bishop Doug Ford and stewarded by Fr. Greg Clark. Future development plans of our beautiful property include a covered walkway to link an outdoor courtyard to the Memorial Garden. These will be used for welcoming outdoor services, and to enhance the God-given beauty of our location overlooking the town of Cochrane and the Rocky Mountains.
