Get a modest place and be content there until you leave. And if you're not welcomed, if no one listens to you, then quietly withdraw. Don't make a scene. Shrug your shoulders and be on your way." Then they were on the road. They preached with joyful urgency that life can be radically different; they sent the demons away; they brought wellness to the sick, anointing their bodies, and healing their spirits.
