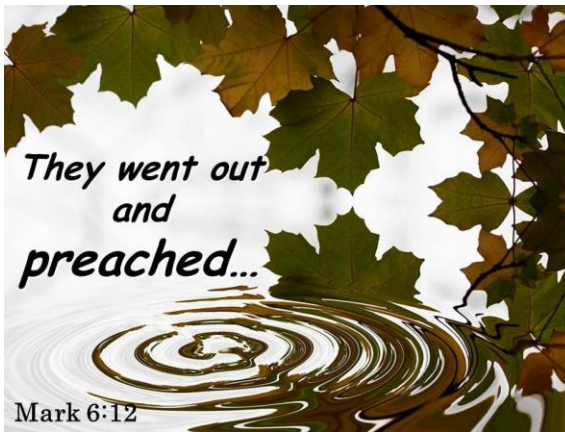

From our Primate Archbishop Linda Nicholls June 25

It is hard to put into words the agony of this time as we hear more news of the indignities to Indigenous people at residential schools. Anger and disbelief that those who profess to follow Jesus could act with such disrespect for the dignity of human livesprofound sorrow for families who were separated and never told what had happened to their children.....Pain at the treatment of children who deserved love, joy, learning and respect.....guilt that the systems which created residential schools have not been dismantled in our structures or sufficiently repudiated in our relationships.....

Lamentation takes on a new and deeper reality in our time. It must lead also to actions of repentance and change....The Anglican Church of Canada has begun that work - but there is much more to do. May the pain be transformed into courage and perseverance in action with God's help!
