Today's Scripture

I Chronicles 29: At the end of David's life he begins to gather the materials needed for his son Solomon to build a temple for God.

I Peter 2: This reading contains a rich tapestry of images, most of which connect with images from the Old Testament. They all set the qualities of a new life in Christ.

Matthew 21: Jesus upsets the religious leaders by cleaning out the temple and healing people.

Today's Christian Priority: Renewal

WEEKLY PRAYER

The following is a resource to help you connect with Sunday's theme & continue your prayers through the week. This can be done on your own or in the family group. This liturgy is based on Home Prayers found in the Book of Alternative Services (p. 687). If you do not have a prayer book, please take & keep one for your use.

The Christian Priority of **Renewal** waxes & wanes depending on the seasons of the church. A well-known theologian, Karl Barth, once wrote that the church is always in need of reform. In every age, in every generation, the Followers of Christ seek out ways to connect with the world to bring God's love to it. This is our call & is the reason why we must always be reformed or renewed. If we do not seek reformation or renewal for ourselves, how will we be available or open to the working of God's spirit in our own time?

1. The Preparation

A candle is lit as someone prays,

Strengthen us, O God, with your Holy Spirit; empower us for your service; & renew us all the days of our life. **Amen.**

2. The Reading & Reflection

Read the passage from Scripture then reflect using the wonder questions as your guide. This guide uses the New Revised Standard Version.

We will read through the 13th chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew this week. It is a collection of parables. Parables are short stories told by Jesus to get a spiritual message across to his followers. They are often thought-provoking & tend to guide the listener into new ways of understanding something that is difficult to grasp. Jesus used parables a lot in his ministry. In doing so he was able to dive deeply into a spiritual truth without using technical or difficult theological language.

WHY PARABLES? - MATTHEW 13:10-17

Notes on the reading:

- o Jesus' parables befuddled his listeners. They often did not understand what they meant.
- Parables are stories for those "in the know." This does not mean that those "in the know" understand his parables any better than others!
- \circ Parables highlighted the spiritual condition of the listeners. People are hard of hearing or cannot see (i.e. understand) the ways of God. Jesus has come to renew sight \circ hearing.

I wonder what your favourite parable of Jesus is.

I wonder if there is something you don't understand about God that frustrates you. I wonder if you have ever had an epiphany about God or your place in the world.

RENEWAL IS ABOUT GROWTH - MATTHEW 13:3-9, 18-23

Notes on the reading:

- Jesus uses earthy imagery in his parables to get his message across. He does not depend on technical or theological language.
- This is an example of Jesus telling a parable to the crowds & telling his followers what it means privately.
- God's kingdom is like a seed that is planted in various places. God's messages are found everywhere, no place has exclusive rights to God's message.
- $_{\odot}$ One way to read this parable is to reflect on how the soil of our hearts can be renewed to be good soil.
- o No one is stuck being one kind of soil.

I wonder how your understanding or faith in God has grown or changed. I wonder what gives you life in the message of God's kingdom. I wonder where you need a renewal of understanding or depth of spirit.

RENEWAL IS ABOUT DISCERNMENT - MATTHEW 13:24-30, 36-43

Notes on the reading:

- o Jesus uses a simple theological idea to help frame a human conundrum: Evil vs. Good. What do we do about evil now? What do we do about Good now?
- o God's judgment will come when it comes, it is out of our control. What is in our control is how we live our lives. This is the place of discernment ⋄ holds the potential for renewal.
- Sometimes we get so focussed on taking out weeds in our own hearts that we forget to renew our heart.
- O Sometimes we get so focussed on the bad things people do, we forget about the good we can do.
- \circ Jesus want us to stop focussing on the bad \oslash be renewed in the good. God will take care of the bad in good time.

I wonder if there is something you don't like about yourself or someone else. I wonder how you can feed your heart & the heart of another.

RENEWAL IS INEVITABLE - MATTHEW 13:31-34

Notes on the reading:

- o These are two of the most known parables of Jesus.
- Some have said that the mustard seed was considered unclean in Jewish tradition. If this is so, then this parable points out God's presence to renew the world outside of our own traditions.
- Yeast is a fungus that spreads. Jesus is relating God's kingdom to something that cannot be contained or controlled. It is almost like a virus, or, better yet, an anti-dote to a virus.
- God's kingdom, God's renewal of the world is compared to things that seem insignificant in the eyes of people.

I wonder what the smallest living thing you have ever seen is. I wonder how it feels to know that the renewal of our hearts is inevitable.

RENEWAL IS BOTH A SEARCHING AND A BEING FOUND - MATTHEW 13:44-50

Notes on the reading:

- o God's kingdom is found almost accidently (v. 44). Sometimes God surprises us with new life.
- God's kingdom is also something that is found after deliberate searching (v. 45). God rewards those who
 search after the renewal of their hearts.
- \circ God's kingdom is about taking in everything and discerning what is good for our hearts \oslash what needs to be let go.

I wonder how you "found" God. Was it accidentally, after searching, an ongoing process?

3. Prayers & the Lord's Prayer

Choose a litany from the Book of Alternative Services (beginning on page 110). The liturgy concludes with the Lord's Prayer.
