IN-PERSON WORSHIP – Relaxation of Covid Restrictions on Worship Services

Following the move to Phase 3 of the Provincial Reopening plan, our worship is beginning to return to pre-pandemic settings.

It will take time for all of us to get comfortable once again and we need to be careful how we manage people's expectations and the concern for the safety of all.

It is strongly encouraged that masks be worn upon entry to the church and kept on for the entirety of the liturgy.

We will continue to livestream our worship for those who, for whatever reason, are not ready or able to return in person. Worship has been live streamed and recorded since February using two unobtrusive wall-mounted cameras. The camera focuses on the worship leaders. During Communion and Sharing the Peace, the camera will not focus on parishioners. If you have any questions or concerns about being on camera, please ask to speak to a Warden.
