Pastor's Corner

As my daughters are growing up (all too quickly!), one of the areas of which I've been focusing with them is that of personal responsibility. While this is a reality we all know quite well as adults, we too can remember when we were younger and how our parents taught us, over time, to be responsible for all our actions, words, deeds and the like. It

wasn't always easy, and at times we likely dropped the ball. To be fair, sometimes we still do today.

Along with the responsibility of adulthood comes a similar reality - that of accountability. This too was taught and shown to us in our youth by our parents. Our parents were accountable to us to help us have what we needed and to insure our safety and well being. In like manner, we too were accountable to our parents for making sure to do our chores and homework and even helping around the house in other ways. As we talk about responsibility and accountability among parents and children, it makes sense to consider these elements in our relationship with our God and with our family in Christ.
