Project Type: Fall

Supplies

- Paper napkins
- Mod Podge
- Glass jar

Craft tools

- Large paintbrush

Instructions

1. Wash and dry your glass jar.
2. Prepare your paper napkins by separating ply (if needed) and cutting out designs.
3. Apply a thin coat of Mod Podge to the front of your jar.
4. Lay jar on its side with the wet side facing up.
5. Place napkin onto the jar, pressing gently from the center outward.
6. Apply Mod Podge to the bottom, side edges and rim.
7. Using a gentle hand, apply a coat of Mod Podge over the top of the entire napkin.
8. Repeat steps on the back side of the jar.
9. Allow everything to dry completely (overnight is best) before displaying and adding a candle.
10. You can decorate the rim with burlap, ribbon or twine, but this step is completely optional.
