DEFINITION OF A SPIRITUAL GIFT

A spiritual gift is a divinely granted ability to every member of the Body of Christ, His church, to enable them to glorify God, build up others in their faith, and produce growth within the local church.

The Distribution of Spiritual Gifts

*Only Christians have spiritual gifts.

- 1. Spiritual gifts are distributed to believers according to the sovereign purposes and desires of the Triune God (1Corinthians 12:11).
- 2. Spiritual gifts have been given to individual Christians according to the grace of God (Romans 12:6).
- 3. Each and every believer has received a spiritual gift (1Peter 4:10).
- 4. The distribution of spiritual gifts is in the best interest of God (1Corinthians 12:18).
- 5. Each believer receives his/her gift(s) at the moment of his or her spiritual birth (Ephesians 4:7). We come to a growing understanding of our gifts as we minister to others.
- 6. Within the Body of Christ, the members have varying functions based on the gifts which have been given to them (Romans 12:14)
- 7. No one particular spiritual gift or group of gifts is evidence of anyone's salvation. A person's salvation is solely based on the grace of God alone, not the outworking of a gift (Ephesians 2:8-9).
