## Who You Gonna Call?

### Rev. Julia and Rev. Matthew

Starting a new position is always a challenge. Starting the same job with two people, it seems, is also a challenge. Splitting the same job between two people who will be doing essentially the same things poses some interesting dynamics not only for the ministers, but also for the three congregations, especially since each minister's workload is limited to a .8 full-time position or 32 hours per week. Using the precious time of both ministers for dealing with everything, we quickly realized, would be a waste of time and energy and not beneficial for anyone.

For example, who answers emails or questions related to particular ministries? Should both answer, or one, and who would that "one" be? Or, who gets to make the final decision regarding a particular area of ministry? Discussing everything until a decision is made would take a huge amount of energy and time.

Decisions have to be made in a timely and efficient way. How are we going to do ministry between equals if we both focus on the same things all the time and need to check in with each other before we can do anything? We needed something that would allow us to do our work more efficiently and would keep lines of communication clear.

After considerable back-and-forth dialogue, we settled on what we think is a workable solution.

We will split and coordinate complementary areas of ministry for a year and re-evaluate or switch after the year. We decided that there were six primary areas of ministry within the church and that we could each take three to coordinate. That is, each minister will be a **point person** for three areas of ministry, delegating and collaborating with each other and members of our congregations to fulfill each area. **We will each participate in all six but be responsible for coordinating only three.** This way, various ministries and individuals within our congregations will know who to contact for the relevant ministries.

To this end, the following delineates our respective areas of coordination:

**Matthew:   Worship**

**Spiritual Formation/Christian Education,**

**First Third (Children, Youth, Young Adults, Families)**

**Julia:       Congregational/Pastoral Care**

**Social Justice**

**Stewardship**

Knowing that these are our respective areas of ministry allows everyone to **direct their questions to the right person**, avoiding confusion and conflict. If one of us gets an email or inquiry about a ministry that the other is coordinating, we will simply forward that email to the other minister for follow-up.

It will take all of us a while to get used to this arrangement. We are hoping, however, that this will, in the end, give better clarity to our roles and help to serve each community better.

## Children and Youth Ministry

Curious about Children and Youth Ministry this fall? Here's an outline of what's in store!

Instead of a traditional Sunday School program, Julia and I will be striving to make the Sunday morning service as **inclusive** as possible. We want our children to feel part of the family, and to *grow familiar with* the words and rhythms of worship. We are a God-family, after all!

To help with this, we have ordered engaging **Children's Bulletins** that kids can take with them into the sanctuary. We'll also be inviting children or youth to play a role within the service.

In addition, we'll be setting up the Nursery as a **"Quiet Corner"**: a supervised place where kids can go to work through the Children's Bulletin and some other quiet activities. The service will be "piped" into the space so that kids will still be able to take in the songs, stories and prayers.

with an event the *first Friday night of every month*. Anyone Grade 6 and up is welcome! I'll be hosting those events myself, and am thrilled for the opportunity to get to know our youth. We'll build relationships and have fun through pizza and movies, game nights—maybe even bowling!

We'll also be planning a Christmas pageant to share during a Sunday in Advent—stay tuned!
