



THE CHURCH COUNCIL has advised that we can begin our Community Lunches once again! I know I have truly missed this outreach! Let us honor Will and keep this Community Outreach program that he was so passionate about going strong!

Our first Community Lunch will be Saturday, May 1, and the format will be a little different due to Covid-19. We plan to do a drive-thru take-out lunch, with pick-up running from 12 to 1 pm. We will cook the entire meal in our kitchen and we will not be accepting outside donations of food or desserts at this time. We are planning on packaging 100 meals.

We will be needing a limited number of volunteers to help cook, package the lunches, direct traffic in the parking lot, and deliver the meals to the people in their vehicles. We will sanitize, maintain social distancing protocols, and require masks and gloves be worn by all volunteers.

We would need three sous chefs to begin at 9:00 on May 1st to help prepare the meal. Our menu will be Baked Ziti with homemade sauce, green beans, roll & butter, and a brownie.

We will also need volunteers for the following jobs:

- 10:45 4 volunteers to move tables (inside and out) and set up the packaging line in the fellowship hall and then help with packing meals
- 11:00 2 volunteers to package brownies into Ziplock bags
- 11:15 3 more volunteers for the packaging line
 - 2 volunteers to run the lunches outside (up and down stairs!)
 - 4 volunteers to work outside delivering food to cars and controlling the traffic in the parking lot thinking of two lines if needed

Once meals are all packaged, we can tear down the line and clean up the kitchen utilizing the volunteers already there.

We will have a sign-up sheet in the narthex for volunteers or you may call or text me at 716-622-5860 and let me know how you would like to help!

Dear friends,

It is almost a year since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and the implimentation of lockdowns and other measures by most countries in the world to curb the spread of the virus.

Globally, as of 10:15am CET, 26 February 2021, there were 112,456,453 confirmed cases of COVID-19, including 2,497,514 deaths, reported to the World Health Organization (WHO). https://covid19.who.int/ South Africa has reported about 1.5 million infections and over 50,000 related deaths.

Several coronavirus vaccines have been developed and approved for use but access, cost and distribution are matters of deep concern. In an open letter to the leaders of the G7 countries The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) General Secretary Rev. Dr Martin Junge noted: "Wealthy countries have secured their doses, sometimes in more quantities than they need, while other countries and their populations have inadequate or no access at all." https://www.lutheranworld.org/news/covid-19-until-all-are-safe-no-one-safe

The ELCA's Lutheran Disaster Response has responded to appeals from companion churches in Southern Africa to support several programs during the first and now second wave of the pandemic. Activities include distributing relevant information about the pandemic, Personal Protective Equipment and food hampers to vulnerable communities. Lockdowns and restrictions on the numbers of people allowed at

funerals and church services have also affected the pastoral, financial and evangelism work of the churches.

However, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi reported that evangelism training workshops were held in 2020 for pastors, evangelists and youth leaders. The report stated, "The evangelism work has been hard especially during this period of Covid-19. But despite this... trainings and meetings have been going on very well." The report included the story of Mr. Kwayera who attended one of the training workshops. He is an elder and Confirmation teacher in a local congregation. (In the photo Mr. Kwayera is holding up Sunday School and Confirmation resource books translated into Chichewa, the official language in Malawi.)
