A Cloud of Witnesses

Patricia St. John (1919–1993)

The third of five children, Patricia St. John was born on April 5, 1919 in Hastings, Sussex,

England, shortly after her parents' return from Carangola, Brazil where they had worked as missionaries for some years. Her childhood was spent playing with her siblings in the English countryside; these memories would later inspire her first book, *The Tanglewoods' Secret*. One evening, as a young child, as she was listening to the Bible being read, she understood that God loved and cared for her.

When her father returned to missions work the following year, the family moved to Switzerland. Patricia's life in an alpine village later inspired her second book, *Treasures of the Snow*. She was in awe of creation and described it beautifully in prose and poetry.

After finishing high school, Patricia became a nurse during World War II. Nursing in London when bombs were falling was very stressful and tiring for her. Soon after the war, her brother, Farnham, went to Tangiers, Morocco to work as a surgeon in a missionary hospital. They were very close and shared the vision to serve those in physical and spiritual need; Patricia decided to join him.

Patricia's next book *Star of Light* draws closely on the time she lived in a town in the northern mountains of Morocco. For four years

she cared for the poor in her house and visited many of the surrounding villages. Eventually she was asked to leave because the Muslim officials disapproved of her openly sharing her Christian faith.

After traveling about for a while visiting other places, including Rwanda, Patricia returned to Tangiers and set up a nursing training school attached to the hospital. For almost 30 years she lived in Morocco teaching spiritual truth and offering her loving service. The hospital was closed by the government in 1974.

Patricia returned to England in 1975 to live with her sister, Hazel, in Canley, Coventry, where she worshipped at Canley Evangelical Church and taught children's Bible classes from home.

Over the next few years Patricia travelled to Beirut and parts of Africa. In 1985, as Ethiopia was hit hard by a terrible famine, she worked among the poor starving people, feeding and caring for children. As usual after this experience Patricia wrote a book, *I Needed a Neighbor*.

Patricia was a prolific storyteller. She used her daily experiences as short stories to communicate to the children and the youth the love and power of God. During her lifetime she authored some 24 books which have been translated into 40 different languages.

For the remaining years of her life, Patricia kept busy, working with Global Care, a children's charity. She died on November 6, 1993.
