Lesson 1 - Hebrews 1:1-3

Introduction

"Hebrews is profound, distinctive, rewarding, and puzzling. Its impassioned and polished argument for the superiority of Christ captures the imagination even in a quick reading, and its theological depths continue to reward faithful reflection over a lifetime of study."²

At the heart of this epistle is the theme "Jesus is Better"; better than the angels, better than Moses; better. Our goal in this series of studies is to discover just what Jesus being better means, how it reflects on the character of God just how we should respond. Begin this journey by taking the time to read the entire book itself to get a feel for the overall picture.

Study Questions

- 1. What is your current understanding of Hebrews? What ways does this book contribute to Christian theology? How does this book clarify our understanding of the major doctrines of the Christian faith?
- **2.** Examine the following passages and list some of the "various ways" that God spoke to men in the past.
 - Genesis 28:10-15
 - Exodus 3:1-6
 - Exodus 20:1-21
 - Exodus 31:18
 - 2 Peter 1:21
- 3. What do you see in 1:1-2 that indicates a basic unity between the Old and New Testaments?
- **4.** The concept that Jesus is God's ultimate revelation is weighty. How has God spoken to us by his Son? (See 1:2 and also John 1:14; 12:44-46; 14:9-11).
- **5.** What difference does it make to you that Jesus is "heir of all things" and that the Father made the universe through him?
- **6.** Why do you think the author makes such a point of Christ's deity to these Hebrew Christians?
- 7. In what ways does the author of Hebrews present Jesus Christ as superior to the old covenant in these first three verses of the letter? What does Christ's superiority over the old covenant mean for the old covenant?
